



Pak-India tensions; time to move forward



Indian fighter planes intruded into Pakistan territory in the early hours of Tuesday, February 26, claiming to have hit hideouts of JeM. The Indian side also claimed killing scores of JeM people. Consequent reports and investigations proved all Indian claims false as there was no JeM hideout whatsoever in Balakot thus no question of large scale killings. When challenged by jets of Pakistan Air Force, the Indian planes fled from the scene jettisoning the payload. Pakistan the next morning struck back and hit two Indian planes killing two pilots and arresting one alive. The National Command Authority (NCA) of

arresting one alive. The National Command Authority (NCA) of Pakistan met with Prime Minister in the chair and decided to take on all threats emanating from the declared enemy with full force. The Command Authority, that is custodian of nuclear weapons also, further resolved to come up with a matching response in case of any future aggression. Prime Minister Imran Khan the same day in his address on the national hook-up once again invited Indian leadership for talks.

This is a brief summary of what transpired on February 26 and 27 after the Indian aggression against Pakistan. The incident also brought together all political parties of Pakistan thus sending loud and clear message to India that when it comes to national interest and security all political parties are on the same page. The Prime Minister in his brief TV address and then during the joint session of the Parliament on February 28 invited India to shun differences and join hands for peace. He rightly pointed out that wars bring destruction and havoc only therefore all out efforts should be made to avoid any catastrophic situations. Imran Khan's speech and announcement to release the pilot went quite well even in India with Indian politicians and journalists welcoming goodwill gesture of Pakistani PM and exhorting their government to react positively to this gesture.

Even the diplomatic community, which was greatly perturbed over the violent incidents on both sides of the border, heaved a sigh of relief after PM Imran Khan's speech as it was expecting some hardliner stance to be adopted by him but his peace overtures not only won hearts and minds of the diplomatic corps but put a damper on the evil designs of Indians and their future (mis)adventures as well.

Ostensibly, Pakistan outclassed India on foreign policy front for Islamabad chose to reach out to major regional and global powers telling them how New Delhi was undermining Pakistan's desire for peace and stability in the region. As reports suggest, Pakistan fought its case successfully and was able to bring these countries round that it was India who wanted to destroy regional peace. After Pakistan's reaction, all world powers woke up to the reality that by launching aggression against Pakistan, India had set the basis for a conflict that might turn into a limited, if not full scale, war between the two arch rivals.

As Kashmir remains the flashpoint between Pakistan and India, the regional as well global powers need to help both countries sort out this issue for the ultimate good of regional and world peace. Pakistan time and again has expressed its desire for an amicable solution of the issue but never got a positive response from India. Here comes the role of OIC, which by and large is considered as an ineffective organization in terms of its ability of conflict management, nevertheless what it can do is to extend moral support in such situations to the member countries. If the OIC speaks with one voice against Indian atrocities in the occupied Kashmir, New Delhi will then have no other choice but to come to the negotiating table.

Summing up, the intelligentsia of both countries ought to do fire-fighting by encouraging both sides to talk peace, instead of fanning the fire. Media role in this regard is also crucial. Emotional approach will only lead to further tensions and chaos. Let us hope that better sense prevails and both sides sit together to settle their disputes peacefully. Peace efforts should not be held hostage to a handful of

Kazakhstan keen to diversify ties with Pakistan

Ambassador of Kazakhstan talks to CENTRELINE and DNA

Ambassador of Kazakhstan Barlybay Sadykov talked to CENTRELINE and Diplomatic News Agency (DNA). He talked about various aspects of Kazakhstan-Pakistan ties. Here is the text of his interview

ANSAR MAHMOOD BHATTI

Please share with us some key features of Kazakh-Pakistan relations, especially in the fields of diplomacy, trade, politics and culture.

First of all, Kazakhstan and Pakistan have a long history of friendly relationship, with their beginning dating back to the early 1990's. So, since then our countries have never questioned the need for developing and enhancing their bilateral ties.

Apart of that, I always note that Pakistan was among the first nations in the world to have recognized Kazakhstan's sovereignty shortly after demise of the Soviet Union. That was probably the reason of why one of the first international visits of the President of Kazakhstan, Mr. Nursultan Nazarbayev was paid to Pakistan in early 1992. This sort of mutual gestures of respect and honor really matter in inter-state relations and are of extreme importance for making them to develop well in the long run. At present the manifestation of that development is that Kazakhstan and Pakistan have no any political controversies or misunderstandings, which might obscure a bilateral interaction. This outstanding achievement comes from a strong political will of our countries leadership, who always cared of the Kazakh-Pak relationship and advocated them to be constructive as much as possible. Now around 35 bilateral documents regulate partnership between our countries in various domains, but there is still a lot to be done in extending a number of legal instruments for making that partnership even more fruitful.

The trade cooperation does not meet vast economic potential of two countries and needs intensifying

contacts between their business communities. What is crucial now is to increase their awareness of each other and try to reduce those trade barriers, which may be removed with no harm to economic interests or international commitments of Kazakhstan and Pakistan.

Bearing in mind that geographic location and climatic peculiarities make Kazakhstan's economy differ substantially from that of Pakistan, I am certain that at the very beginning our economies should be rather complimentary than competitive towards each other. For instance, Kazakhstan is able to meet Pakistan's needs in supplies of mineral resources, namely oil, gas, coal, ore and some others, given the existence of viable transport routes and implementation of regional projects of TAPI and CASA-1000. Pakistan on its part could be a very competitive supplier of fruits, vegetables, textile and leathermade products, medicines and surgery equipment.

The entire foreign service of Kazakhstan is currently shifting towards strengthening primarily economic diplomacy in developing our country's relationship with the rest of the world. This is to say that the Embassy is also to be strongly in line with this policy to be held here in Pakistan.

Kazakhstan and Pakistan have some opportunities to boost their trade and investment ties, which are to be fully exercised in a befitting way.

The Embassy is planning now to arrange a number of seminars, round-tables and road-shows in Pakistan's economic and industrial hubs in Punjab, Sindh, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and some other areas, with the aim of increasing awareness of local business circles about Kazakhstan, its trade and investment opportunities, as well as tourist potential of our country. In this regard I would like to underscore that the World Bank's «Doing Business» comprehensive report for 2018 has ranked Kazakhstan 28th in terms of the ease of doing business, compared with its position at the 36th place in 2017.

Astana International Financial Center (AIFC), which was officially launched in the mid-2018 as the English-law-based institution, is expected to turn very soon into a regional financial hub, like the Shanghai stock market and the New-York stock market «Nasdaq». Pakistani business community is also highly welcomed to join cooperation with the AIFC.

Culture is another area that can bring Kazakhstan and Pakistan closer and A promising area of cooperation is the linking of the "Nurly Zhol"
Program in Kazakhstan with the CPEC project

better known to each other. And this asset is to be exercised at maximum by both countries, keeping in mind that cultural bonds had been linking peoples of Central and South Asia for centuries. What is needed now, is to revive gradually and patiently this linkage, no matter how difficult it looks like.

2) People to people relations also play a significant role in bringing nations closer. How would you comment on this in reference to friendly relations between Kazakhstan and Pakistan?

- People-to-people contacts are turning to be an extremely important factor in keeping inter-state relationship safe and more predictable in the irreversibly globalizing world. This may also be applied to Kazakhstan-Pak relations. For this reason a growth of people-to-people contacts is the matter of my constant attention as the Ambassador of Kazakhstan.

Currently there is no lack of will to promote contacts between people of Kazakhstan and Pakistan, but a shortage of reliable and effectively dispersed information to be consumed by them for increasing awareness of each other. The challenging task here is to set up a well-functioning information exchange mechanism to create both in Kazakh and Pakistani societies a positive mindset of each other.

3) Another hallmark of bilateral ties is increasing cooperation in defence sector. Can you share some details please?

 Kazakhstan places great emphasis upon cooperation with Pakistan in the military field. Despite a relatively short history of relationship in this domain, military cooperation is one of the most effective and dynamically developing areas in the general context of bilateral interstate interaction.



The Defence Attache Office of Kazakhstan has been functioning under the roof of the Embassy since 2002.

The main areas of focus are military education, special force training and military-technical interaction.

For instance, since 2005 up to the present 42 military personnel and members of the armed forces of Kazakhstan have been trained in military education centers in Pakistan. In 2018 four officers of the armed forces of Kazakhstan underwent in Islamabad a training course of military observers. This year another group of militaries from Kazakhstan are expected to arrive at Pakistan for being trained as part of peacekeeping forces.

The level of trust and military partnership was also demonstrated by the cooperation in the field of combat training. In November of 2017 the first ever Kazakh-Pak Counter-Terrorism drills "Dostarym-2017" were held in Pakistan on the basis of the National Anti-Terrorism Center in Pabby. The second Counter-Terrorism exercises are expected to be held in Kazakhstan in 2019.

The annually held meetings of the Kazakh-Pak Joint Military Commission is fully authorized to identify, arrange and coordinate any practical cooperation actions between the defence ministries of two countries. Bilateral cooperation in military-technical field is to be regarded as a separate domain under the competence of the Joint military-technical Commission. This Commission's inaugural meeting is also scheduled to be held in 2019. The Embassy on its part is fully determined to be a visible part of this process.

4) Is there any possibility of cooperation between two countries in civil-nuclear technology?

- Despite of being a strong and persistent

advocate of the nuclear-arms-free world, Kazakhstan at the same time believes that it is any country's inalienable right to use nuclear energy in the civil area and develop civil-nuclear technologies under international surveillance, dual attitude towards ways of nuclear energy exploitation lay behind of Kazakhstan has taken a massive initiative to set up and allocate the IAEA Low-enriched Uranium Bank that shall be at the disposal of other countries for meeting their civil-nuclear needs under the watch of the International Atomic Energy Agency. Apart from that Kazakhstan is one of the biggest producers of natural uranium, which is essential for developing civilnuclear technologies.

There are no obstacles for developing cooperation between Kazakhstan and Pakistan in civil-nuclear domain, given that terms and forms of that cooperation are correctly identified in accordance with the international obligations under non-proliferation instruments like NPT, CTBT, NSG and other documents to which Kazakhstan and Pakistan are parties.

5) What are the prospects of bilateral cooperation in Agriculture field?

- Pakistan is well-known worldwide as agro-industrial country, blessed with very comfortable geographic and climatic environment, allowing reaping the harvest twice, or even thrice a year. Therefore, Pakistan is hard to be beaten in the region as importer of fruits and vegetables. Thus, Pakistan's vast expertise in the field of agriculture may be well exercised though opening joint Kazakh-Pak enterprises in growing fruits and vegetables, particularly in Kazakhstan, which lacks them due to its climatic specificities.

6) Kazakhstan has tremendously reduced poverty. Can you share with our readers steps taken by your government to reduce poverty?

Kazakhstan is country, which encountered with considerable socioeconomic miseries immediately after the collapse of the Soviet Union almost 28 years ago, as many traditional economic links with other parts of the Union simply severed and turned to be unworkable. Restoration of these ties has always been a matter of concern of the leadership of Kazakhstan, whose leader President Nursultan Nazarbayev ultimately succeeded to lead our country through turbulent age and to ensure its steady development and economic progress. A visible indicator of this outcome is the reduction of poverty, which since the early 1990's decreased down to 13 times. It



became largely possible thanks to correct identification by the President and national Government of most urgent economic problems and ways of their solution. This mode of economic policy is mirrored in long-term strategic documents, designed to put respective developmental targets to be achieved by Kazakhstan by 2030 and 2050. Here I am talking about «Kazakhstan-2030» and «Kazakhstan-2050» strategic documents, which are the most essential strategic documents to be read by anyone, who wants to acknowledge what Kazakhstan's developmental goals are about and how they are expected to be addressed.

But in fundamental terms the most important factors needed for reducing poverty are a well-educated society and friendly business environment, Currently Kazakhstan is doing its best to meet these two major terms. The first challenge is that almost 100 percent of literacy rate of the Kazakh population is to be transformed into a globally competitive national education system. The second one is about establishing in Kazakhstan a friendly business and investment environment, which is of vital importance for extending employment rates and consequently, reducing poverty and social vulnerability. According to «Doing Business» latest data for 2019 Kazakhstan is ranking now as 28th in terms of ease of doing business. But keeping in mind that Kazakhstan has officially declared its intention to join by 2050 the list of 30 economically most developed nations of the world, there is still a lot to be done to further go up in this raning.

7) Kazakhstan as we know strongly believes in nuclear non-proliferation and has taken a number of steps in this regard. Can you share some details in this regard?

Nuclear disarmament and nonproliferation have remained a hallmark of Kazakhstan's foreign policy since the country got sovereignty in 1991 and up to the present. This sort of "obsession" by this issue definitely derives from practical knowledge Kazakhstan had get under the Soviet rule of the damage may be caused by use of nuclear weaponry. This is to remind that Kazakhstan had been through several decades the area of nuclear arms testing at Semipalatinsk site. The consequences of those tests caused irreparable damage to the country's environment and health condition of our nation. But the ban to hold arms tests at Semipalatinsk nuclear tests site in 1989 and its consequent closure in August of 1991 was only an overture to what followed then, when Kazakhstan got independence.

Our country was among those former Soviet republics, who inherited a massive nuclear arms arsenal of the late USSR. To be more precise, by early 1992 Kazakhstan appeared to be a sovereign owner of more than 110 ballistic missiles with 1200 nuclear warheads. The uneasy dilemma of whether to keep or get rid of them was solved by the President of Kazakhstan Nursultan Nazarbayev in favor of the latter. Following his decision that nuclear weaponry was either dismantled in Kazakhstan or removed out of the country. This unexampled in terms of its courage decision was accompanied by signing of the range of bilateral agreements between Kazakhstan and nuclear powers, who guaranteed security of Kazakhstan in exchange of its renouncing a status of a nuclear arms possessing nation.

Nowadays Kazakhstan is known as being in the vanguard of international efforts to make the world free of nuclear arms and to minimize a plausibility of their practical exercising. In this regard the President of Kazakhstan Nursultan Nazarbayev while addressing at the 70th session of the UN General Assembly in 2015 called the international community to strive for achieving a nuclear-arms-free world by 2045 - the UN's 100th Anniversary, and to consider elimination of nuclear weaponry as its primary goal in the 21st century. That was also Kazakhstan's initiative behind the adoption by the UN General Assembly on December 7, 2015 of the Universal Declaration on the Achievement of a Nuclear-Weapon-Free World.

Kazakhstan fully admits that total elimination of nuclear weaponry is indeed a formidable task for considering it as the easy-to-achieve one. Uneasy nature of this problem probably originates from deeply rooted distrust among nations and their mental unpreparedness to give up from possessing nuclear arms. But at the same time omnipresent belief in impossibility for the world to survive in nuclear war remains a credible ground for keeping efforts to make this Damoclean sword over the humankind to disappear once and for all.

8) What is importance of CPEC for Central Asia in particular and Kazakhstan

- Kazakhstan chiefly views CPEC as one of



the most important directions of Chinainitiated 'One Belt, One Road' strategy, which was originally articulated by the Chinese Chairman Xi Jinping in Astana during his first official visit to Kazakhstan in 2013. Kazakhstan unequivocally supported that grandiose idea of our Chinese partners and revealed its intention to be a part of it. Therefore, CPEC is likely to be an economic project to provide badly needed linkage between entire Central Asia and Kazakhstan in particular with Pakistan via China. At the bilateral meeting, held in 2017 on the sidelines of the Shanghai Organization Cooperation Summit in Astana between the President of Kazakhstan, Mr.Nursultan Nazarbayev and the then Prime Minister of Pakistan Nawaz Sharif the leader of my country lauded CPEC.

The development of the 'Gwadar' seaport and the reconstruction of the Karakorum highway, which will connect China's Xinxiang province with Pakistan with a new high-speed and high-altitude road are of particular interest for Kazakhstan in this regard. This interest is based upon a growing opportunity for Kazakhstan and other Central Asian countries to get access to the Indian Ocean and sea trade communications.

A promising area of cooperation is the linking of the "Nurly Zhol" Program in Kazakhstan with the CPEC project.

At present, there is already work being done with aim of adopting the Kazakh-Pak "Road map" to enhance bilateral trade and economic relations as a whole through identifying points of overlapping interests of both Kazakhstan and Pakistan within 'One Belt, One Road' strategy.

9) Your impressions about Pakistan? - I am personally really stunned with ancient culture and history of Pakistan, which are closely inter-related with the ones of Central Asia. Another great asset of Pakistan is its hospitable people, who are to lead the country towards fully deserved brighter future. As the Ambassador the more I get to know about Pakistan, the more I get aware of its importance for global politics. So, I am certain that staying and working in Pakistan is a great chance for any diplomat to grow both professionally and intellectually.

MBS's visit lays foundation for new era in Pak-Saudi ties

The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and Pakistan reiterated their commitment to continue combating extremism and terrorism and expressed their deep appreciation for the achievements and sacrifices made by the two sides in the war against terrorism.

SLAMABAD, (DNA) - Saudi Crown Prince Mohammad Bin Salman and his high powered delegation left Islamabad on Monday after a two-day official visit to Pakistan.

According to a joint communique released, the Saudi Crown Prince's visit has laid foundation for a new era in Pakistan-Saudi Arabia ties and investment and trade relations have been given high priority during the visit as Saudi Crown Prince announced 20 billion dollars investment and signed agreements and MoUs in various sectors in Pakistan.

The statement said that the establishment of Supreme Coordination Council, its subsidiary mechanism are one of the key steps in shaping the new trajectory in the bilateral relations. Crown Prince praised Prime Minister Imran Khan s agenda of transforming Pakistan into a welfare state, based on Islamic socio-economic principles and assured him of the Kingdom's continued support.

Prime Minister Imran Khan expressed gratitude to the Crown Prince for his immediate consent to release 2107 prisoners from Saudi jails. The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and Pakistan reiterated their commitment to continue combating extremism and terrorism and expressed their deep appreciation for the achievements and sacrifices made by the two sides in the war against terrorism. They also applauded the martyrs who sacrificed their lives in order to confront this serious scourge and called on the international community to shoulder its responsibilities to join all international efforts to combat global terrorism. They also underlined the need for avoiding politicization of UN listing regime.

"The two sides expressed their hope for achieving a fair, comprehensive and long-lasting peace in the Middle East in accordance with the Arab Peace Initiative and the resolutions of international legitimacy guaranteeing the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people, including the establishment of an independent and viable Palestinian state based on internationally agreed standards 1967 with Jerusalem as its capital" the statement said.

kiing in Pakistan has been in vogue for a very long time.
Earlier it was not considered to be a sport; instead, local residents of snowy mountainous terrain of northern areas used improvised wooden skies to commute in

winters. Pakistan Air Force formally pioneered skiing in the country, by introducing this sport as part of the snow survival training for its aircrew. Slowly and gradually, the sport gained popularity and PAF finally decided to patronise it in the country. Consequently, in December 1990 the formation of Ski Federation of Pakistan (now renamed as Winter Sports Federation of Pakistan) was the first modest step by PAF, towards promotion of skiing in the country. PAF also offered this facility to Government Departments, Sister Services, civilians and students at its Ski Schools at Naltar and Kalabagh (Nathia Gali). The Federation is affiliated with the Pakistan Olympic Association (POA) and is a member of its executive council. It is also a recognized body with the Pakistan Sports Board (PSB). Internationally, it is affiliated with the International Ski Federation (FIS) and the Asian Ski Federation (ASF). The goal of WSFP is to promote winter sports in the country, making it accessible to all enthusiastic young boys and girls by offering sports gears and training to all. WSFP also sends talented skiers to famous skiing countries for their professional training and improvement in their technical skills. National and International Championships are held every year, while Pakistani skiers have also been sponsored to represent the country in international competitions. Pakistan achieved a landmark in sporting history of the country, when Mr Muhammad Abbass, an employee of PAF, qualified for the Winter Olympics 2010 at Vancouver, Canada. It was the opening of a new chapter as Mohammad Karim, a local lad from the area, carried the national flag in the Sochi Winter Olympics in 2014.

NUST, Azerbaijan embassy organized seminar on Khojaly Genocide

ISLAMABAD, (DNA) - The Embassy of Azerbaijan in collaboration with the National University of Sciences and Technology (NUST) organized a Seminar on "Conflicts, Genocides, Wars Never again.

Peace and Stability through Credibility" at NUST H-12 Campus, Islamabad. Dr Tughral Yamin Associate Dean at NUST-Centre for International peace & stability in his opening address welcomed all the guest & participants.

Dr Tughral said Khojaly genocide, which was committed by the Armenians in the Azerbaijani town of Khojaly on the night of 25-26 February 1992, is considered one of the gravest crimes against humanity in the late 20th century.

Mustafa Yurdakul, Ambassador of Turkey were also present at the occasion, he said that "This merciless and cruel genocide was the most dreadful mass terror act in the history of humankind.

"Turkey didn't forget Khojaly genocide. As many as 613 people, including 63 children, 106 women and 70 old people were killed in the massacre. Eight families were totally exterminated, 130 children lost one parent and 25 children lost both.



Some 1,275 innocent residents were taken hostage, while the fate of 150 people still remains unknown. Ali Alizada Ambassador of the Republic of Azerbaijan also expressed his views regarding the Russian-backed massacre of innocent Azeri.

He said: "This genocide is a source of constant pain in the hearts of Azerbaijanis and it is wound which will never heal.

"He appreciated Pakistan's support for Azerbaijan on the Nagorno-Karabakh issue and for standing by the victims of Khojaly genocide.Pakistan has not extended recognition to the newly independent state of Armenia to express solidarity with the people of Azerbaijan, he added.

He also thanked the NUST administration for arranging the seminar for the students as it would help them know more about the issue.

The chief guest Dr Fehmida Mirza Federal minister for Inter provincial coordination, in her address highlight Armenian armed forces massacred innocent people in Khojaly, in order to cover their tracks, they resorted to extreme brutality, destroying Khojaly monuments, which had been of unique importance to both the people of Azerbaijan and entire humanity.

Khojaly does not differ from horrific tragedies of Katyn, Lidice, Oradoursur-Glane, Holocaust, Songmy, Rwanda, Srebrenica & ongoing genocide by India in Kashmir, which are etched on the minds of people forever.

These atrocities went down in the history of wars as genocides of civilians that shook the world. In his concluding address Lt Gen Naweed Zaman, HI (M), (Retd), Rector NUST also highlighted the 'Nagorno-Karabakh' conflict and its future prospective, recounted the historical background of the massacre terming it a tragedy of 20th century and explained its counter effects on the civilized world. At the end of seminar a short video was also featured on topic "call for peace" by Azerbaijani children.=DNA

Korea provides equipment for conservation of movable heritage

ISLAMABAD (DNA)- Pakistan and South Korea have warm cultural relations which are deep routed in the history. Especially, common heritage of Buddhism is of particular importance for further cementing cultural and religious ties between the two countries.

Mr. Aamir Hasan, Secretary of the National History & Literacy Division, Syed Junaid Akhlaq, Director General, Department of Archaeology and Museums, Islamabad and other officials from both sides participated in the handing-over ceremony that took place at the Islamabad Museum on Thursday.

On this occasion, Ambassador Kwak Sung-kyu re-emphasized the importance of promoting cultural ties between the two friendly countries and reviewed the coprojects that were completed in the last two years such as;



Uzbek govt to join hands with Pakistan in building cultural links: Ambassador Furqat



ISLAMABAD, (DNA) — Uzbekistan in collaboration with the Punjab government has planned to upgrade and further beautify the Shalimar Garden in Lahore. The Uzbek government will bear expenses incurred on this project.

Ambassador of Uzbekistan Furqat Sidikov disclosed this while talking to DNA. He further said Uzbekistan attached great importance to preservation of heritage adding his country ranked top among those countries having a rich cultural and historical heritage. The ambassador said, Pakistan happened to be a close friend of Uzbekistan and in order to further strengthen these friendly bonds the Uzbek govt has planned to expand its cultural cooperation with Pakistan.

The ambassador said Uzbekistan was developing at a fast speed adding his country was one of the main political and trade partners of Pakistan in Central Asia. The year 2018, he said, was very significant in bilateral relations especially in the field of trade and economy.

He added, in 2018 475 bilateral meetings were held with representatives of leading Pakistani companies besides organising 30 visits of Pakistani companies to Uzbekistan for trade and investment matters.

Additionally, 17 bilateral visits were made between Uzbekistan and Pakistan including at the level of foreign ministers, military establishment, secretary of Security Council, ministries of trade, investment and others. He added, trade and economic cooperation between the two countries has also increased manifold.

In January-December 2018 trade turnover between both countries grew for 170 per cent and amounted to 98.4 million US dollars. Last year this indicator was only 36 million US dollars.

Last year Pakistan's exports to Uzbekistan amounted to 63 million US dollars and continue to grow steadily, he added.

In 2018 the embassy worked on 7 investment projects totalling more than USD 40 million. Of these, 3 investments agreements were concluded during the visit of the Minister of Foreign Trade Khojaev to Pakistan in April 2018.

The ambassador further said, according to the ministry of foreign affairs of Uzbekistan in 2018 with the assistance of the Embassy, 30 joint ventures with participation of Pakistani capital were established in Uzbekistan. He said the Uzbek president Shavkat Mirziyoyev has declared 2019 as the year of active investment and social development. "Investment is the driver of economy. Malaysia eying greater trade prospects with Pakistan: High Commissioner

ISLAMABAD (DNA) — Ikram Bin Muhammad Ibrahim, Malaysian High Commissioner has said Malaysia is keen to have greater bilateral trade with Pakistan as both countries have good potential to trade of many items.

He said that Malaysia and Pakistan have been doing business for over half a century, but lack of exchange of private sectors has held them back from realizing actual trade potential. He was addressing business community at Islamabad Chamber of Commerce & Industry.

Malaysian High Commissioner said that instead of exporting finished goods, Pakistan should focus on producing high quality components for global brands.

He said it was important for Pakistan to focus on those products that have greater demand in global market to improve its exports. Pakistan's services sector including telecommunication, insurance and tourism. He said agriculture, education and other sectors were other potential areas of mutual cooperation between two countries.

He said for attracting more FDI, Pakistan should focus on bringing its informal economy into formal sector that would give more confidence to foreign investors.

He said food processing products of Pakistan have good potential in Malaysia. He assured that Malaysian investors would be encouraged to explore Pakistan for JV and investment. Speaking at the occasion, Ahmed Hassan Moughal, President, Islamabad Chamber of Commerce & Industry said that Pak-Malaysia bilateral trade was not encouraging and stressed that both countries should facilitate private



For This purpose, Pakistani companies should improve branding of their products. He said visit of Saudi Crown Prince Muhammad Bin Salman and announcement of over \$20 billion investment in Pakistan was highly positive development for Pakistan's economy. He said interest of UAE, Qatar and other countries in Pakistan was also good sign for foreign investors. He said that forthcoming visit of Dr. Mahatir Mohammad, Prime Minister of Malaysia to Pakistan on its national day carried good prospects for Pakistan, especially in automobile sector.

He said that private sectors of both countries should accelerate efforts to take full advantage of Pak-Malaysia FTA signed in 2008.

He said Malaysia was one of the larger investors in Pakistan and was more interested in sectors in promoting two-way trade. He said that many Pakistani products including rice, wheat, mangoes, halal food, seafood, meat products, cutlery and sports goods, spices, handicrafts, light engineering goods, hospital and surgical equipment, pharmaceuticals and gems and jewelry could find good market in Malaysia and it should import these products from Pakistan that would also improve Pakistan's trade balance with it. He said Malaysia has levied export duty on Crude Palm Oil (CPO) at certain level of prices (at above RM 2,250), which should be revised. He said Malaysia has also imposed 5 to 7% duties on import of mango and mandarin from Pakistan, which needed to be reviewed to benefit Pakistani exporters.


Pakistan is a big market and we want to tap the growing opportunities, he added. He stressed that Pakistani businessmen should explore investment opportunities in his country.


