



Parliamentary Elections in Azerbaijan



Azerbaijan, an important transcontinental country with a population of around 10.14 million inhabitants, steadily continues its journey towards development and modernization after declaring its independence from Soviet Union in 1991. The architect of the Republic Heydar Aliyev incurred upon himself the onus of driving the nascent republic to a modern and forward looking state where people of all nationalities, religions and faiths could co-exist happily. After passing away of Heyder Aliyev his son Ilham Aliyev stepped into shoes of his father with a view to not only furthering his agenda of development and harmony but to make

The Heydar Aliyev Foundation has been actively participating in building a new society and contributing to the social and economic development of the country, by implementing various projects in spheres such as education, public health, culture, sports, science and technology, environment, and social and other spheres. President of the Heydar Aliyev Foundation is Azerbaijan's First Vice President, First Lady, UNESCO and ISESCO Goodwill Ambassador Mehriban Aliyeva, under whose guidance the Foundation has undertaken a number of humanitarian projects in Pakistan as well. The Foundation immediately started relief work after the deadly earthquake in Pakistan. Since then the Foundation has established a number of schools, especially in Kashmir where mostly the needy children get education. The humanitarian work of this Foundation has not only won laurels for Azerbaijan at home but abroad also. Both Pakistan and Azerbaijan share common views on many issues including Kashmir and Nagorno-Karabakh. Armenia forcibly annexed the Azerbaijani territory Nagorno-Karabakh in early 90s despite the fact that the international community declared that the area was a legitimate part of Azerbaijan. As a result of war hundreds of Azerbaijnai people lost their lives while tens of thousands were left homeless. Nevertheless both countries are holding peace negotiations on regular basis after ceasefire announced in 1994. Pakistan whole-heatedly supports Azerbaijan on this issue and has not recognized Armenia only because it continues to occupy Azerbaijani territory, Similarly Baku supports Pakistani's stand on Kashmir and believes in settlement of the dispute as per the UN resolutions. The early parliamentary elections in Azerbaijan have been announced for February 9, 2020. The electorates shall elect their representatives for the Milli Majlis. The Central Election Commission has already announced polls schedule and list of contesting candidates. This time a big number of youths has registered themselves as voters and candidates. According to analysts, the new parliament is supposed to set basis for a strong and prosperous Azerbaijan. Relations between Pakistan and Azerbaijan are constantly on the move. The respective Azerbaijani ambassadors have contributed greatly towards strengthening of bilateral relations but during the tenure of Ambassador Ali Alizada bilateral relations have been given new dimensions. Besides exchange of high level bilateral visits, trade and economic activity has also seen marked surge. Tourism happens to be yet another area where both countries have made huge strides in past few years. A 12-member observers' delegation from Pakistan, which happens to be one of the biggest, is a clear manifestation of close and brotherly relations between the two countries. Bilateral relations for sure will remain on the same positive trajectory even in the prospect.

From aid relationship to trade relationship

Former Senator Enwer Baig fetes Alice Wells; lauds her role in strengthening US-Pakistan relations

SLAMABAD, -Alice G. Wells, the Acting US Assistant Secretary for South and Central Asia, has said the United States was keen to transform its ties with Pakistan from aid relationship to trade relationship adding tings were moving in the right direction.

She expressed these views while speaking during a reception hosted by former Senator Enver Beg, The dinner reception was attended by several retired generals, diplomats, and prominent journalists.

She said during Prime Minister Imran Khan's meeting with President Trump both sides had agreed on transforming this relationship with special emphasis on cementing trade and economic ties.

Ms. Wells further said "I have the fondest memories of serving in Pakistan back in late 90s and glad to see a number of friends around tonight".

She said Pakistan offers huge business opportunities and many US companies are already engaged in Pakistan and many more want to come here for business purposes.

The senior US diplomat also appreciated Pakistan's role in the ongoing peace talks in neighboring Afghanistan and said that Pakistan and United States have seen unprecedented cooperation in the context of Afghan peace talks. Alice Wells further said US-Pakistan relationship is important one adding she was pleased to be part of further developing and strengthening this relationship.

She added, Pakistan Army Chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa has played a vital role in the Afghan peace process and reiterated on several occasions that peace in Afghanistan is very important for Pakistan and the country would continue its efforts to bring peace and stability in the region.

The Taliban have recently agreed to a reduction in violence, and Pakistan Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi last week had said that the announcement

by the group was an essential step towards a peace agreement in Afghanistan.

Ambassador Wells also met with Brig (r) Ijaz Shah, the Federal Minister for Interior. Among other issues, both officials held talks about stopping illegal immigration to the United States, streamlining the verification of passports and travelling documents.

The visiting US delegation was also given a detailed briefing by officials at the Pakistani interior ministry about the progress regarding the Financial Action Task Force.

Enwer Beg's and his family accorded warm welcome to the Ms. Wells and her delegation when they arrived at the Jehlum house on the outskirts of Islamabad. Senator Beg, during his remarks, said that he had the pleasure of knowing Ambassador Wells since 1999 when she served as the political head at the US Embassy in Islamabad. He said that he hoped the visiting diplomat would have constructive meetings with the officials in Islamabad, and the relationship would move forward.

Senator Baig further said Ms. Wells is a great friend of Pakistan and the Baig family adding her visit will contribute greatly towards further strengthening of Pakistan, US reactions. He said she knows most of the political leaders of Pakistan and genuinely wants to bring both countries closer.

Among the other notable guests were General (r) Ehsan Ul Haq, the former Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staffs Committee, Lt Gen (r) Asif Yasin Malik, the former Secretary of Defense, Riaz Hussain Khokar, the former foreign secretary, Ambassador Abdul Basit, Dr. Ashfaque Hasan Khan, former advisor to the finance ministry, Lt. Gen ® Tariq Khan former Corps Commander Mangla Corps.



Wells appreciates Pakistan's efforts against illegal US immigrants

The chief US diplomat for South Asian affairs, Alice Wells, said that the issue of illegal Pakistani immigrants in the United States had been resolved to a great extent. She made the comment during a meeting with Interior Minister Brig (r) Ijaz Ahmad Shah. "We appreciate the Pakistan government's cooperation on the matter," Wells said, while adding that her government wants to come up with a strong system [for dealing with illegal immigrants] that can be used in the future. Welcoming the idea of developing a system to deal with illegal immigrants, Shah said that a stronger system to verify travel documents had already been created. He further told Wells that a system had also been created for the monitoring of international nongovernmental organisations (INGOs), "The organisations that we have reservations about are given the chance to present their perspective," Shah said.

The two sides also discussed Pakistan's progress on matters raised by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF). "It is heartening to see that Pakistan's government has made significant progress on these matters and that too in a short time," Wells said.

Wells also held meetings with representatives from Pakistan's political and military leadership to talk about several issues, including Pak-US ties, the Afghan reconciliation process, ongoing tensions in the region and Indian atrocities in Occupied Kashmir.

She also spoke at a think tank and engage with members of civil society on what the US State Department calls "issues of bilateral and regional concern".

The US diplomat visit was a follow up on the foreign minister's discussions in Washington where he met US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, National Security Adviser Robert O' Brien, and Under Secretary of Defence John Rood.

The foreign minister recently concluded a three-day visit to the United States – the third leg of his mission to defuse tensions in the Middle East – after having already visited Tehran and Riyadh as part of Pakistan's diplomatic efforts to ease tensions in the region.

Wells also met Adviser to Prime Minister of Pakistan for Commerce, Textile, Industry & Production and Investment Abdul Razak Dawood in Islamabad on the first day of her official meetings, "The US is eager to increase the trade potential between our two nations, Wells was of the opinion that agriculture was one sector where immediate progress can be made,"

Dawood said in a series of Twitter posts after the meeting.

He said the assistant secretary handed over some suggestions on the utilisation of general system of preferences which the Ministry of Commerce of Pakistan will examine and hold appropriate discussions with the US administration.

"She [Wells] appreciated the role of several prominent US companies working very successfully in Pakistan for a long time, & assured keen interest of several others to come here. This will further strengthen Pak-US economic & trade relationship," Dawood further said.

Blacklisted firms got CPEC project contracts, says Wells

Alice Wells during her visit renewed criticism of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), impliedly urging Islamabad to rethink its involvement with it

Amb Wells' speech at a think tank event on January 21, 2020, which was attended by members of academia and representatives of civil society, criticised the flagship project of China's One Belt One Road Initiative.

She alleged that there was no transparency in CPEC projects, claiming Pakistan's debt burden was growing due to the Chinese financing.

While her arguments looked like a repeat of the remarks she had earlier delivered at the Wilson Centre in Washington on Nov 21, 2019, the claims were renewed during her Islamabad trip a few days after Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi sought closer engagement and a robust trade and investment relationship between Pakistan and the US.

FM Qureshi had also sought help from the US to get the country off the Financial



Action Task Force (FATF) grey list.

While reiterating the allegations against CPEC, Amb Wells said companies blacklisted by the World Bank had got contracts in the CPEC.

The US diplomat also questioned the immunity from prosecution for the newly formed CPEC Authority that served as the focal body working to identify new areas of cooperation and projects, besides facilitation, coordination and monitoring of ongoing projects.

About the debt problem, Amb Wells insisted that Chinese money was not assistance. By getting Chinese financing for the projects, Pakistan was buying expensive loans and as a buyer it needed to be aware of what it was doing as this would take a heavy toll on its already struggling economy, she contended.

The diplomat also touched on the cost escalation in railways ML-1 upgrade project. The link connects Karachi with Peshawar. She urged the government to be transparent about the mega project.

A Foreign Office statement, meanwhile, said US Acting Assistant Secretary of State for the Bureau of South and Central Asian Affairs Alice Wells met Foreign Secretary Sohail Mahmood.

The agenda of the meeting largely comprised bilateral issues including the prospects of intensifying political engagement and expanding economic partnership. "It was emphasised that a strong trade and investment relationship was key to advancing the shared vision of the leadership of both countries for a long term, broad-based and enduring partnership," the statement said.

While talking about human rights abuses by Indian troops in the occupied Kashmir and Delhi's aggressive actions against Pakistan, including intensified LoC ceasefire violations, Mr Mahmood emphasised the need for international community to play its role for ending the rights violations and peaceful resolution of the dispute.

About peace and stability in Afghanistan, the foreign secretary reaffirmed Pakistan's resolve to continue to support the peace process and pursue positive development in Pak-Afghan relations. Pakistan also remained committed to supporting the efforts for de-escalation of tensions and promoting the prospects of a diplomatic way forward on the differences and disputes in the Middle East, he said.

In a meeting with Special Assistant to the Prime Minister Nadeem Babar at the energy ministry office, Amb Wells said the US was ready to enhance cooperation with Pakistan in the energy sector especially in the renewable energy. Mr Babar proposed cooperation in tapping Pakistan's Shale reserves, specialised training, investments in LNG infrastructure development, renewable energy and other avenues.

Chinese embassy in Islamabad however rebutted claims of Ms. Wells and said Chinese loans were much less than that of IMF and other financials institutions.

Says unilateral Indian decision in Kashmir has disturbed regional peace

ISLAMABAD,- Ambassador of China Yao Jing has said Western propaganda against CPEC was baseless adding the mega project would continue despite all negative campaigning.

The Chinese ambassador was speaking during a reception he hosted to mark the Chinese new year.

Ambassador Yao further said one thing is very clear for the Chinese leadership and Chinese government that Pakistan remains a strongest and firm and best friend of China.

He said in the year 2019 a lot of regional and global changes happened however friendship of China and Pakistan remained steadfast and firm in all times.

The ambassador said some vested interests sometimes try to damage China-Pakistan relationship by casting adverse aspirations on CPEC and sometimes by fanning religious issues.

The ambassador particularly mentioned Western propaganda in Chinese Xinjiang province and made it clear Muslims living in that province were enjoying all rights like other Chinese citizens. Therefore the Western propaganda was baseless and unfounded and a dime a dozen attempt to create misunderstandings in Muslim countries.

He said many Pakistani delegations have already visited this province and interacted with Muslims living there.

The ambassador also talked about Kashmir adding unilateral Indian decision has disturbed regional peace. He said the United Nations resolution on Kashmir must be respected.

On Afghanistan the ambassador said China wants stability in that country and would continue its efforts towards that end.

According to Yao Jing, the Year 2020 will also be a historical year to usher in a new chapter of win-win cooperation between China and Pakistan. As an iron brother, Pakistan will always be the prior partner in China's external relations.

China and Pakistan will strengthen mutual support and strategic cooperation. As good neighbors, good friends, good partners and good brothers who share weal and woe, we will continue to build upon our mutual trust and firmly safeguard sovereignty, territorial integrity and national dignity.

China and Pakistan will enhance cooperation to achieve common



development. We continue to promote the high-quality development of the CPEC.

We will deepen cooperation in trade and investment, support the development of manufacturing industry in Pakistan, increase employment and expand exports, and help Pakistan to accelerate integration into the international industrial chain.

He re-pledged that China would like to increase people to people ties between the two countries. China and Pakistan will encourage more people-to-people contacts. Ambassador Yao Jing reiterated that they will consolidate international cooperation to work for regional peace.

They will strengthen coordination and cooperation on major international and regional issues, jointly safeguard the purposes and principles of the UN Charter, support multilateralism and win-win cooperation, and highlight the representation and voice of developing countries on international affairs.

About his country's socio-economic rise, he said, the year 2020 will also be a landmark year of the great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation. China will complete its thirteenth Five-Year Plan, eliminate absolute poverty completely, build a moderately prosperous society in all respects. He pointed out that the year 2019 is of great historic significance for China's development. Over 1.4 billion Chinese people celebrated the 70th anniversary of the founding of the PRC.

US-Iran tussle may have spill over impact: CGSS rountable

ISLAMABAD, (DNA) -Experts on Wednesday opined any further escalation of US-Iran tussle may have spill over impact on the region especially therefore both sides need to exercise restraint.

The experts expressed these views during a roundtable organized by Center for Global & Strategic Studies (CGSS), Islamabad titled "Escalation between US and Iran; Regional Implications and Options for Pakistan".

Major General Syed Khalid Amir Jaffery HI(M), (Retd), President CGSS, Lieutenant General Naeem Khalid Lodhi (Retd), Former Federal Minister of Defence, Major General Shakeel Hussain (Retd), Former Ambassador of Pakistan to Sri lanka and others participated in the debate.

The participants stated that the US-Iran tussie is three dimensional that is global, regional and its effects on Pakistan. Iran's main objective is withdrawal of the US forces troops from Iraq and other Middle-Eastern countries.

The US and Iran tension will result in increase of oil prices and possibilities of proxy war in the Gulf region will further worsen the situation. While US is trying to bring normalcy in its relations with Pakistan, the current situation will continue to test Pakistan's various commitments with US in context of US-Taliban peace talks. In addition, Pakistan will have to maintain a strategic balance between Saudi Arabia and Iran.



US wants complete foothold in Middle-East and will continue using such proxy war tactics. Moreover, Arab world is divided and polarized. The developing scenario can also provoke US to target more Iranian interests in the region.

It is the need of the hour that global powers must use their influence to deescalate the situation. China has offered military assistance to Iraq and Russia is already involved in Syria and Iraq.

US is losing her global allies and is now isolated in the international arena. Amongst the Muslim countries in Middle-east, only Iran has the capable potential to fight against US. Qasem Soleimani's assassination is the violation of international law and violation of Iraq's territorial sovereignty.

In case of full fledge war, Pakistan will have to decide its stance and has to come up with a policy. India can also benefit from such situation and can create further tensions at the eastern border of Pakistan. Pakistan must adopt a pragmatic foreign policy to tackle this situation and adopt a management strategy.

The leadership of Pakistan must engage in mediation process through bilateral visits to Iran, US and other major players. Pakistan must call Parliamentary Session to discuss National Security and create consensus.

In the past, Pakistan has successfully maintained its neutral stance on various global issues including Iran-Iraq war and Yemen crisis. However, it is about time that Pakistan must frame a policy to come

Embassy to encourage Czech businesses, investors: envoy

KARACHI, (DNA) – The Ambassador of Czech Republic Tomas Smetanka has assured that Czech Embassy would try its best and strive hard to provide as accurate information about Pakistan as they can to the Czech businesses, investors and anyone who might have slightest interest in Pakistan's market with a view to promote trade and investment ties between the two countries.

President KCCI Agha Shahab Khan, Senior Vice President Arshad Islam, Vice President Shahid Ismail, Honorary Consul General of Czech Republic in Karachi Ansari and KCCI Managing Committee members attended the meeting.

Czech Ambassador mentioned that during the last three to four years, the trade exchange stood at around US\$200 million per annum, of which one third was Czech exports to Pakistan while two-third was Pakistan's export to Czech Republic.

"It means we get more from Pakistan than we export which is partly because of the GSP Plus that has facilitated Pakistan's exports to European Union.

The next step will be to raise our exports to Pakistan and we will also be enhancing cooperation with the business community of Karachi Chamber to promote trade", he added.

Identifying some areas of cooperation, the Envoy said that Czech Republic has been producing a lot of sophisticated machineries, weapons, passenger cars, transport system etc. but a very small portion of this huge production was being exported to Pakistan which needs to be focused.

Soleimani martyrdom has united all Muslims: Iranian ambassador

ISLAMABAD, (DNA) — Embassy of the Islamic Republic of Iran in Pakistan has organized the Commemoration ceremony on the occasion of the seventh day of mourning for the Martyrdom of Lt.General Qassem Soleimani.



He was killed by the United States while fighting with child-killing terrorists for many years. US officials have admitted that the US itself has created these terrorists.

He added Commander Soleimani was striving for peace and security for all the nations of the region. He was seeking to provide security, stability and peace for all by fighting terrorists.

There were no differences in this path between Shiites and Sunnis, Christians, Kurds, Turkmen, Izadis and so on. Even a foreign official praised the commander for supporting Syrian Christians.

For Martyr Qassem Soleimani, humanity and human lives mattered most. He was martyred for the sake of serving and



sacrificing for humanity and providing human rights, the most obvious of which is security and the right to life.

The Iranian ambassador General



Soleimani was successful in defeating the US and the Zionist regime in achieving their development goals in the region and in Islamic countries.

Referring to the faithfulness and steadfastness of the martyr Soleimani in his covenant with God, he said: "Haj Qassem did not go astray in the path of righteousness all the time and never backed down. He was true to his covenant, word, and demeanor, and there was no change in the course of his faith, but the difficulties of his path added more value and strength to his faith."

Referring to the de-escalation in the region, he said: "This is an issue that is being raised by European and other countries these days. However, Iran has never been and will not be in pursuit of tension. Iran, for example, has been 100 percent committed to its commitments under the nuclear deal and has been fully in cooperation with the International Atomic Energy Agency. Even Europe and the US have acknowledged it".

Hosseini added "The crusading side that led to further tensions was the American regime and the Trump administration. He went out of the nuclear deal and destroyed it. Then, he imposed illegal and inhumane sanctions against Iran, and launched an economic terrorism against our nation.

Pakistani figures including Prime Minister's spokesman Nadeem Afzal Chen', Allama Mohammad Amin Shahidi, chairman of the United Ummah Assembly, Allama Sayed Iftekhar Hossein Naqvi, head of the SCTV, Mian Aslam from the Jamaat Party. Islamist and Mufti Golzar Naimi, a Sunni Pakistani cleric, also expressed condolences on the occasion of the Martyrdom of General Qassem Soleimani to the Iranian nation and government.

They condemned the assassination of General Soleimani and his companions in a terrorist act by the United States, which exposed the common enemies of the Muslim world and said: "General Qassem Soleimani is a martyr for the path of Al-Quds and the liberation of Palestine. Soleimani united all Muslims with his martyrdom." DNA





percentage.

very tourist's journey to Naltar begins by leaving behind the ■ Karakoram Highway at Gilgit for an adventurous two-hour jeep ride. The fact that cars can't be driven from Gilgit to Naltar is testament to the bumpy and somewhat arduous track. However, for those with the slightest clue of what beauty lies in the valley, the journey is simply part of the experience and is most certainly worth taking.

Reaching Naltar Bala, the center of the valley, one is absolutely spell-bound by the beauty of the area. What makes Naltar particularly unique is also that its forest cover is vaster than other areas of the country. The entire landscape is truly delightful to the eyes.

In the evening as the sunlight gradually disappears, the few residents of the valley return to their homes after working the fields during the day. Stars begin to emerge, which combined with the silence of the night, make for an exquisitely serene atmosphere. Further into the night, aided by the lack of light pollution, the Milky Way emerges from behind the mountains. The view leaves you

During the winters, Naltar offers a wonderful experience of skiing on its famous slopes that attract tourists by the droves. The ski resort is run by the Pakistan Air Force, along with the recently installed ski lifts that take skiers to the top of the slope.

Naltar is home to three magnificent lakes

known collectively as the Bashkiri Lakes. Located at a distance of 13km from Naltar Bala, it takes about an hour of travelling on unmetalled roads to reach them. All along the route, which is a dirt track, glacial streams can be seen flowing across the verdant valley floor. Due to the ample vegetation, these are ideal grazing. grounds, attracting Gujjar nomads who travel here with their cattle.

At two points in particular, the river and a large glacial stream cut across the track and as a result, the local jeep drivers are required to utilise their experience and skills in order to navigate them. During the winters however, these lakes remain inaccessible as the route is blocked by up to 15 feet of snow.

As the jeep made its way to the first lake on our way, I tried to picture the lakes I had seen in photographs before. But nothing prepared me for my first sight of Satrangi Lake. I was left awestruck.

After all, it was hard to believe that a lake could reflect as many colours as this one from having seen just a couple of pictures. True to its name which means seven coloured, the most prominent colours were blue, green and surprisingly, yellow, a colour I had never seen before in a lake. The calm, peaceful water lay still as the underwater plants particularly algae provided more colour from under the pristine water surface.


