US-Taliban Doha deal



The US and Taliban, in the presence of Afghan leadership and representatives of key stakeholders, struck an 'historic' deal in Doha on February 29, 2020 with a view to pulling the war-torn country out of chaos and turmoil. The country has been bearing the brunt of upheavals of various sorts for last four decades. Over two million people, most of them, innocent, have lost their lives while millions rendered homeless. The Afghan nation that otherwise happens to be an industrious and resilient nation, was not allowed to exhibit its real skills and potential because of this turmoil. The peace deal, if it

goes well, would ostensibly provide the Afghan people with an opportunity of not only exploiting their capabilities to the full, but also to play a constructive role at the

world stage.

However, there are certain issues that may become a hard nut to crack for all stakeholders, especially the key stakeholder i.e Taliban and the incumbent Afghan government for both of them are supposed to sit together and chalk out the future road map as to how Afghanistan shall be governed and by whom. As per the deal, the Afghans will have to find a solution themselves taking everybody on board. There are many factions in Afghanistan that claim to have support of sizeable majority. All such factions will have to be taken on board for a lasting solution. It is the most difficult task, yet not insurmountable. Taliban, in the peace deal vowed to shun past and make a new beginning, which seems quite encouraging development. Former Afghan ambassador to Pakistan Mullah Abdus Salam Zaeef said after the signing of peace deal that Taliban of today are much different from Taliban of the past. According to him today's Taliban are fully alive to modern day advancements adding they have broaden and enlightened their world vision as well.

According to the deal, the US and allied forces will complete their withdrawal from Afghanistan within 14 months. In return Taliban will have to make sure their ranks are not used for attacks on US or allies and that they full cooperate to make a peaceful Afghanistan. As Taliban leaders would put it, the conditions laid down in the deal are easy to comply with and since there is strong resolve on the part of all Taliban factions that this time the opportunity shall not be allowed to go waste therefore there appears a potential likelihood of peace returning to the war-ravaged country.

Here one has to admit role of the neighboring countries particularly Pakistan, Uzbekistan and China both in ensuring lasting peace in Afghanistan and enabling Afghans to stand up on their own feet in the coming days. All these countries undoubtedly have played significant role in paving way for the Doha deal and it is expected that they would continue to work for stability in Afghanistan with same spirit and interest. And they have to do it for the sake of Afghan people and for their own sake for stability of these countries is directly linked to stability in Afghanistan.

As rightly pointed out by the Foreign Minister of Uzbekistan his country stands ready along with the government of Afghanistan and other international partners to participate in implementation of the railroad transport projects Mazari-Sharif -Heart and Mazari-Sharif - Peshawar which will connect Central and South Asia.

Likewise, CASA 1000 is yet another important energy project that can be completed only when there is peace in Afghanistan. This energy project will ensure cheap

electricity to Pakistan.

Taliban even in the deal did not withdraw from their status of Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan but as Mullah Zaeef said this matter can be settled during intra-Afghan dialogue, which is likely to start from this month in Oslo, Norway. Further progress in this regard largely depends on the US administration as to how it conducts itself during this period. Unfortunately the US has a history of backtracking from its vows and pledges – a fact that makes this exercise a bit dubious. However this should not negate the opportunity the deal creates for Afghan

peace process.

Azerbaijan continues its stride towards prosperity

Elections to bring further prosperity and development in Azerbaijan; youth zealously take part in the entire process; international observers term the exercise transparent and up to the mark

People of Azerbaijan exercised their voting rights in the recently held parliamentary elections on February 9 as a result of which new government came into being. These elections were important in many ways. For the first time a greater number of youths participated in the elections both as voters and candidates. The new parliament that emerged after the elections has vowed to carry forward agenda of President Ilham Aliyev that seeks to gear up reforms process in the country.

According to results, the ruling New Azerbaijan Party (YAP) won 69 seats in the parliament, the independent candidates — 41 seats, the United Azerbaijan Party — 3 seats, Party for Democratic Reforms — 1 seat, the Great Creation Party — 1 seat, the Popular Front Party of Whole Azerbaijan — 1 seat, the Azerbaijan Democratic Party — 1 seat and Civic Solidarity Party — 3 seats.

During the process, a total of 76,000 surveys were conducted, with approximately 640-650 surveys at each constituency, said Birnbaum. The margin of error at each constituency was 3.6 - 3.9

19 political parties freely participated in the elections. Chief Election Commission of Azerbaijan remained neutral and impartial which instrumented to uphold the true spirits of international standards pertaining to fair, free and transparent election in the country.

According to official statistical data total voters were 5.3 million in which 6189 voted for the first time. Moreover, 79



percent were males and 21 percent females candidates in the election which also highlighted positive development in the political system of Azerbaijan, the pioneer of secular democracy in the region and rest of the Muslim world since 1918.

A z e r b a i j a n , a n i m p o r t a n t transcontinental country with a population of around 10.14 million inhabitants, steadily continues its journey towards development and modernization after declaring its independence from Soviet Union in 1991. The architect of the Republic Heydar Aliyev incurred upon himself the onus of driving the nascent republic to a modern and forward looking

state where people of all nationalities, religions and faiths could co-exist happily. After passing away of Heyder Aliyev his son Ilham Aliyev stepped into shoes of his father with a view to not only furthering his agenda of development and harmony but to make Azerbaijan a leading regional and global player. And his efforts ostensibly bore fruit thus making Azerbaijan one of the leading political and economic players.

Azerbaijan under President Ilham Aliyev continues its march towards progress and prosperity. The govt top priority appears to be better facilitation of people by providing them all basic necessaries of life. The Heydar Aliyev Foundation has been actively participating in building a new society and contributing to the social and economic development of the country, by implementing various projects in spheres such as education, public health, culture, sports, science and technology, environment, and social and other spheres.

President of the Heydar Aliyev Foundation is Azerbaijan's First Vice President, First Lady, UNESCO and ISESCO Goodwill Ambassador Mehriban Aliyeva, under whose guidance the Foundation has undertaken a number of humanitarian projects in Pakistan as well. As a result of war hundreds of Azerbaijnai people lost



their lives while tens of thousands were left homeless, Nevertheless both countries are holding peace negotiations on regular basis after ceasefire announced in 1994. Pakistan whole-heatedly supports Azerbaijan on this issue and has not recognized Armenia only because it continues to occupy Azerbaijani territory. Similarly Baku supports Pakistani's stand on Kashmir and believes in settlement of the dispute as per the UN resolutions.

Relations between Pakistan and Azerbaijan are constantly on the move. The respective Azerbaijani ambassadors have contributed greatly towards strengthening of bilateral relations but during the tenure of Ambassador Ali Alizada bilateral relations have been given new dimensions. Besides exchange of high level bilateral visits, trade and economic activity has also seen marked surge. Tourism happens to be yet another area where both countries have made huge strides in past few years. A 12-member observers' delegation from Pakistan, which happens to be one of the biggest, is a clear manifestation of close and brotherly relations between the two countries. Bilateral relations for sure will remain on the same positive trajectory even in the prospect. Azerbaijan government, after the parliamentary elections, has vowed to peruse the reform agenda with full force. The newly elected members of parliament while talking to Pakistani media delegation expressed strong resolve to work for the betterment of the country irrespective of their political affiliations. They supported the reform process and assured that once implemented, fate of people shall be changed altogether.

They said present government under President Ilham Aliyev was fully alive to problems faced by people and assured an early resolution of these problems.

On the sidelines of the elections drill, the delegates were also taken to other cities of Azerbaijan. Pakistani delegation chose to visit Cave of Seven Sleepers in Nakhchivan and some other historical sites such as tomb of Noah and salt mine. The city of Nakchivan is enriched with cultural and





Pak media team visits AZERTAC news agency **HQs**; Chairman briefs of media cooperation

AKU, (DNA)- Azerbaijan and Pakistan enjoy excellent relations in all fields and these relations have grown steadily and strongly with the each passing day. Both countries have cooperated with each other on various forums and Azerbaijan is indebted to Pakistan for not recognizing Armenia that occupies Azerbaijani territory Nagorno-Karabakh.

Aslan Aslanov Chairman of the Board, Vice President of OANA and Azerbaijan State News Agency AZERTAC said this while talking to a media delegation from Pakistan. A 12-member delegation comprising senior media persons is currently in Baku to observe upcoming parliamentary elections to be held on February 09.

He said OANA was the biggest information agency in the region and under the framework of this information service Azerbaijan and various media houses have joined hands for exchange of news etc.

He said Pakistan was an important and brotherly country therefore Azerbaijani media outlets were keen to further expand and strengthen their cooperation with Pakistani counterparts.

He said they already had reached an MoU with Pakistani state owned news agency while such MoUs with other news agencies were also under consideration.

Aslan Aslanov also talked about Baku Humanitarian Forum and highlighted role of this forum in development and strengthening of Azerbaijan relations with other countries.

He said Heydar Aliyev Foundation headed by the First Vice President Mehriban Aliyeva was actively engaged in Pakistan on a number of humanitarian and relief projects.

He said AZERTAC had offices in 21 countries adding they will soon have an office in Islamabad as well. The opening of office in Islamabad is a manifestation



of our commitment and strong desire to expand and cement ties with Pakistan in all fields.

"The process to open AZERTAC office in Islamabad is in final stages. We have already shared a revised MoU with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan and as soon as we get a green signal from them we could establish an office", he added.

The Chairman said they published information in 80 languages adding the social media even in Azerbaijan was getting popularity at a fast speed. He said millions of people now use social media platforms to share information



and stay connected.

To a question Aslan Aslanov said the purpose of signing MoUs with various media outlets was to share information and experiences adding the social pages of their news agency were very popular and 90 per cent of especially the young people accessed our site through various social media platforms.

He said AZERTAC was founded by the Government of the Azerbaijan on March 1, 1920, functioned under various names during the Soviet period.

Giving a brief background, he said, the Agency restored its historical name after Azerbaijan regained state independence. From March 3, 1995 to January 17, 2000, the agency bore the name 'State Telegraph Agency under the Cabinet of Ministers", and then was renamed "Azerbaijan State Telegraph Agency"

He further said, along with the official government information, AZERTAC wires in Azerbaijani, English, Russian, French, German, Arabic, Chinese and Spanish languages the round-the-clock news covering all spheres of life in Azerbaijan including politics, economy, culture, sports, health, environment and

Aslan urged the Pakistani media to join hands with them in order to further promote and develop bilateral relations adding media played an important role in strengthening bilateral relations.=DNA

Azerbaijan's Parliamentary Election 2020: an overview

Parliament election was held in the Republic of Azerbaijan on February 9, 2020 wherein people voted with free will. Neither any government department nor any regulatory

bodies intervened in the electoral process. Moreover, Chief Election Commission remained impartial and neutral during the pre & post electoral process.

19 political parties and a large number of independent candidates participated in the election for 125 seats. Every political party and independent candidate had equal right of contest, political campaign, public interaction, media projection, utility of virtual means and above all rallies. There was not a single incidence of engineered rigging in the entire electoral process and parliament election was held in free, fair and transparent manners

According to latest report of the CEC the ruling party secured more than 80 seats and independent candidates also showed their strong presence by winning various seats in the parliament election. Victory of the ruling party is the vivid reflection of people's trust on the ongoing socioeconomic structural reforms.

The OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) submitted its preliminary statement indicating some shortcoming in the election. It was mere error of human judgment in various procedures. Even Azerbaijan foreign ministry immediately responded to this statement and showed its disagreement on certain issues pertaining to so called shortcomings and labeled it mere procedural mistakes at individual levels. The foreign ministry statement upheld that snap parliament election was the reflection of Azerbaijan people's will for further politicization and democratization in the country. It showed its willingness to continue its cooperation with international organizations. including OSCE/ODIHR on a fair and constructive basis. It is now proved that the preliminary statement of the OSCE/ODIHR is full of misconceptions & misperceptions and self-contractions,

More than 50 per cent candidates were below 40 year participated in the election. There were 5,573 polling stations. Total voters were 5.3 million. Most of them



were independent with higher education. More than 90 per cent of the 1,314 candidates from the 19 contesting political parties were university graduates. For the first time even facility/provision of exit poll was also allowed in the country. 6,189 people voted for the first time. 79 per cent of the candidates were males, and 21 per cent were females which showed vibrancy of Azerbaijan society and its traditions which granted the women right to vote in 1918 by the Azerbaijan Democratic Republic even before most of the Europe. Some 89,676 local observers and more



than 900 international observers were granted accreditation to observe the election. Some 199 representatives from 132 international mass media outlets were given access to cover the election. So, preliminary statement of the OSCE/ODIHR is baseless. In the last parliamentary election held in 2015, the ruling New Azerbaijan Party (YAP) won 69 out of 125 seats and according to latest figure it has now won 81 seats which reconfirmed that people of Azerbaijan trusted the socio-economic reforms of the government.

OSCE/ODIHR also mentioned low participation of women in the snap parliament election. In the last parliament election held in 2015 there was only 141 women participated in the election whereas, 344 women candidates nominated by the political parties an increase of 2.4 times. So, observation of the OSCE/ODIHR does not match with the reality.

OSCE/ODIHR statement also mentioned low turnout in the currently held parliament election. According to CEC turnout was acceptable as it was only 32 % in the local bodies election in 2019. It was 47 percent in the snap parliament election 2020 which showed that a free, fair and

transparent voting was carried out in the county. If there were any engineered rigging or rampant proxy voting as mentioned by the OSCE/ODIHR turnout would have been on higher side. The CEC ensured transparency in the process of nomination, registration of candidates, meetings with voters which showed that all conditions had been created for candidates in the parliament election.

Elections have been held in Azerbaijan on regular basis since its inception. Even Azerbaijan Democratic Republic (ADR) was formed, developed and survived through fair, free and transparent elections. The journey from electoral democracy to substantial and liberal democracy may not be achieved within a

day, week, month or year.

On its part the Republic of Azerbaijan has been striving hard to achieve equilibrium between an economic sustainability and liberal democracy since its inception. The Azerbaijan Democratic Republic (ADR) being pioneer secular democracy in the entire Muslim World and in the region laid out the foundation of political pluralism, justice, protection of basic rights of minorities and provision of basic human rights. The dawn of the Republic of Azerbaijan (AR) also continued the true democratic spirits of the ADR and exceled in every sphere of life and art of governance.

The SCO, CIS, OIC, the Parliamentary Assembly of the Turkic-speaking countries (TURKPA) and the Interparliamentary Assembly of Member Nations of the Commonwealth of Independent States (IPA-CIS) and many more showed their complete satisfaction over the election process and termed it free, fair and transparent in all respects.

The OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) preliminary statement does not show the real picture about the election. It has some serious miscalculations and misperceptions too. It seems that despite highlighting the positive attributes of the snap parliament election, the statement confined only to its own fabricated and false notions which are in reality merely a

It pinpointed some so called serious shortcomings during the election process especially on the day of final political battle i.e. election day in counting and proxy voting. Foreign Ministry of Azerbaijan immediately responded it and termed it not true and factual. Procedural errors are commonly reported in all over the world and labeled it errors in human judgment. Azerbaijan also upheld it as human errors which had not been schemed or supported by any governmental organizations.

Being prominent regional expert of



Azerbaijan & CIS I suggest that the government of Azerbaijan and the Chief Election Commission should take some meaningful steps to enhance the volume of political activities in the country. Sincere efforts should be taken to change the system from "unicameral" to "bicameral" until the next parliament election in the country. It is suggested that "feasibility" of holding "joint elections" i.e. local/municipal & parliament may be a workable idea to increase political participation in the country.

There is scope of improvement in the political sphere of Azerbaijan because absence of real optics i.e. limited exposures of rallies, processions, corner meetings, hanging of posters, pamphlets and last not the least, door to door political campaigns always create elements of doubts and suspiciousness in the eyes of foreign international observers

and organizations alike.

Media plays a crucial role in the election process and its meaningful interaction may further increase elements of fair, free and transparency in the election process. There is a vital need to formulate the future "strategies" for appropriate media coverage, projection and contribution in the days to come. Azerbaijan is a civilized country with one of the highest literacy

rates among the all the regional countries must find out "innovative means" to disseminate political messages, discussions and debates during the pre & post-election scenarios. FM radios, regulated "Youtube" Channels and series of interactive sessions among all the participating candidates during the electioneering may bring the desired goals of arduous participatory political system and turnout in the country.

Azerbaijan has its own ideal model of "multiculturalism" which is indeed basis of its democratic journey, political stability, social strength and last but not least economic sustainability. It is hoped that successful holding of snap parliament election 2020 will open new window of opportunities, exploration of untapped potentials, improvement in the process of operationalization and channelization of national resources and human capitals and will also cater the basic needs of the common people. Simply collective free will of its people/voters prevailed in the recently held snap parliament election in Azerbaijan. Ultimately, democracy secured victory over vicious circles, notorious schemes and ill designs of the regional as well as international forces and their franchises.

Being International Official Observer, I must appreciate the sincere efforts of the Chief Election Commission and strong political will of the government to hold a snap parliament election despite having comfortable majority in the dissolved parliament. The western international observes and organizations must understand the basic differences of a political system and social harmony and do not try to disturb the equation of survival and productivity. Every country has its own unique political parameters, converging to its traditions, culture and heritage and being a democratic country the Republic of Azerbaijan implements the ideal matching-box of politics and societal forces to foster its ongoing socioeconomic structural reforms and consolidate its future persuasions of qualitative life for all the people.

Pakistan to continue supporting Azerbaijan on Nagorno-Karabakh: Senator Mushahid

Ambassador Alizade savs double standards on Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir must be shelved; thanks Pakistan for whole-hearted support





ISLAMABAD, (DNA) -The Khojaly genocide is one of the most serious crimes in history not only against the people of Azerbaijan but humanity as a whole said Senator Mushahid Hussain Sayed Chairman Senate Defence Committee, on Monday.

He expressed these views at a Seminar on "Together for Peace and Humanity. End to Ethnic Cleansing and Genocide" dedicated to 28th anniversary of Khojaly Genocide organised by NUML in collaboration with the Embassy of Azerbaijan on Monday.

Other dignitaries of the seminar included Sakib Foric Ambassador of Bosnia and former President of Azad Kashmir Sardar Anwar.

The Director General National Institute of Modern Languages (NUML) welcomed the guests.

Senator Mushahid said Pakistan and Azerbaijan have always been on the same page. He stated that Pakistan faces a similar situation in Kashmir, so Pakistan is well aware of what the people of Azerbaijan sense and is very grateful to the people of Azerbaijan for their support on the Kashmir issue.

The Khojaly genocide is most definitely one of the worst massacres the world has seen- the gravity and enormity of the situation is overwhelming and cannot be justified and the way the people of Azerbaijan have come out of this bilateral issue is highly commendable.

Senator Mushahid Hussain Sayed stated that Pakistan has given unreserved support to Azerbaijan. He highlighted the commonality between the situations in Kashmir and Nagorno-Karabakh.

Pakistan and Azerbaijan have a solid history and in the future there needs to be greater coordination between both countries especially on the issues of Kashmir and Nagorno-Karabakh.

He said that Pakistan and Azerbaijan are linked by histories and intense exchange of thinkers. Pakistan has provided endless support to Azerbaijan and has consulted its efforts with Azerbaijan in highlighting this tragedy.

He also drew attention to the Human Rights report and UN resolutions which described the event in Khojaly as "the largest massacre to date in the conflict".

He also highlighted the insensitivity of the international community, the silence of global media, and, no major actions from major powers. The Ambassador of Azerbaijan Ali Alizada gave a brief overview of the events of the genocide—the Khojaly graveyard is a symbol of all the atrocities that took place during this incident. He made it clear that the world should exercise same principles and rules while dealing with the issues of Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir. The world must stop exercising double standards, he emphasized.

He stated that history provides evidence that such events can occur in the future too, and to avoid this repetition he said that there has to be a uniform stand against this crime and the perpetrators need to be brought to justice.

The Ambassador was very appreciative of the friendship between the two countries and the solidarity between the two nations and acknowledged that Pakistan was one of the first countries which



















recognised this massacre as genocide.

He stated that the Khojaly massacre is a bloody episode of human history and a bloody page of the policy of ethnic cleansing and genocide pursued by the Armenian nationalists against Azerbaijani people over a hundred years.

He stated that the principle position of

both countries on humanitarian issues demonstrates their fidelity to international law and upholding of human rights and international human law and serves to reinforce the deep bonds of friendship between the two nations. The ambassador also quoted national leader of Azerbaijan Heydar Aliyev who said on many occasions that Armenians had unleashed a systematic genocide of innocent Azerbaijani people. Ambassador Alizada called for collective efforts on the part of the international community in order to ensure peace and stability both in Nagorno-Karabakh and Kashmir. = DNA

BAKU, (DNA) - Hikmat Hajiyev Assistant of the President of Azerbaijan and Head of Foreign Policy Affairs Department, office of the President of Azerbaijan has said Azerbaijan accords immense importance to its relations with brotherly country Pakistan adding his country was indebted to Pakistan for supporting Azerbaijan on Nagorno-Karabakh issue.

He said Pakistan in fact was the third country after Turkey and Romania that recognized Azerbaijan therefore our relations are deep-rooted and have

historical perspective.

He expressed these remarks while meeting with a delegation of senior Pakistani journalists, who are in Baku to observe parliamentary elections 2020.

He said Azerbaijan considers Kashmir as disputed area and calls for its resolution through UN resolutions and dialogue.

"Azerbaijan and Pakistan closely cooperate on various regional and international forums including the OIC. The OIC needs to address issue of Islamophobia. Azerbaijan is a country of religious tolerance; harmony and people hailing from various faiths and sects are living side by side in Azerbaijan".

To a question about early elections in Azerbaijan Mr. Hikmet said the parliament happens to be the executive branch of the government and the snap elections for sure would create harmony and further understanding.

He cited an example to further elaborate his point as to why the snap elections were called saying if you have a nice Apple processor but if the printer is not adaptable

then you have you change it.

"The snap elections would help gear up reforms process in Azerbaijan and the new parliament is likely to support and augment the process of reforms in various fields", he added.

He said due to drastic steps taken but the incumbent government the level of poverty has decreased to only four percent while ratio of unemployment has also reduced considerably.

He said owing to economic and social reforms of the government Azerbaijan now happens to be the high income countries of



He said much emphasis has also been laid on improvement and development of infrastructure in the country and country now stands out as one of the most development states not only in the region but in the world also.

Hikmat Hajiyev further said Azerbaijan is keen to enhance and strengthen trade and economic relations with Pakistan. Azerbaijan is also taking keen interest in Gwadar port adding Gwadar can really be beneficial.

When asked to comment on CPEC project and Azerbaijan's prospects of joining it, he said it was indeed an important project adding Azerbaijan was keen to enhance its links with various countries mainly thru road and rail links.

He told that a railway line from Azerbaijan to Iran was in the final stages and through Iran Azerbaijan can be connected with



Pakistan. Likewise from Pakistan Azerbaijan can have access to Chinese markets also.

Apart from political relations, Azerbaijan and Pakistan have cooperating in the defence field also.

To a question about direct air links he said there was a direct flight between the two countries however it had to be stopped because according the airline it was not economically viable.

While agreeing with the preposition that direct air links were a sine qua non for strengthening of trade and economic relations, he said both sides have to find ways and means in order to resolve connectivity issues.

While identifying various avenues of mutual cooperation he said Pakistan is good in textile and Azerbaijan would like to encourage Pakistani exporters to export textile related products. This can certainly cement bilateral relations between two countries.Likewise, Pakistani mangoes are also very popular in Azerbaijan. Similarly Pakistani oranges are also very popular and Azerbaijan imports citrus from other countries. It can be yet another area which can bring both countries closer in terms of trade and economic relations.

He also underlined the need for deeper cooperation in tourism sector also. Both countries are blessed with a plethora of touristic attractions therefore tourists from both countries can be encouraged to visit these places.-DNA

Minister Nurvshev made it clear his country strongly believes in nuclear non among those former Soviet republics, who inherited a massive nuclear arms arsenal of the late USSR. The uneasy dilemma of whether to keep or get rid of them was solved by the first President of Kazakhstan Nursultan Nazarbayev in favor of the latter. Following his decision nuclear weaponry was either dismantled in Kazakhstan or removed out of the country. Dilating further on bilateral relations the minister said both sides

Rangoon-Bangkok-Kuala Lumpur-Saigon-Singapore. Similarly Garuda Indonesia has so intermediate points while coming to Karachi, including Singapore-Phnom-Penh or BangkokColombo or Bombay. And from Karachi the Indonesian airline also has some points beyond including Cairo or Beirut-Algiers-Rome-Paris-Amsterdam-London.

Flight operation between Kyrgyzstan and Pakistan to start soon: minister

abusar Pass or Babusar Top elevation 4,173 metres or 13,691 feet) is a mountain pass at the north of the 150 km (93 miles) long Kaghan Valley, connecting it via the Thak Nala with Chilas on the Karakoram Highway (KKH). It is the highest point in the Babusar Valley that can be easily accessed by cars. The Babusar Pass connects Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with Gilgit Baltistan. It is one of the most dangerous routes in Gilgit-Baltistan. Every year many deaths happen here due to the mountainous slopes, which are among the most dangerous in the world. The most common reason for death is the brake failure of cars due to inexperience. Babusar Top was originally known as Babur Top, originating from the fact that the Mughal emperor Babur used to pass through this area in the early 16th century. Nowadays however, it is commonly referred to as Babusar

Top.[2] The Kaghan Valley is at its best during summer (from May to September). In May, the maximum temperature is 11°C (52°F) and the minimum temperature is 3°C (37°F). From the middle of July up to the end of September the road beyond Naran is open right up to the Babusar Pass, However, movement is restricted during the monsoon and winter seasons. The Kaghan area can be accessed by road via the cities of Islamabad or Peshawar.

The mountain ranges which enter the Mansehra District from Kashmir are the offshoots of the great Himalayan system. In the Kaghan Valley, the mountain system is the highest of the area including the Babusar Top. This range flanks the right bank of the Kunhar River, and contains a peak called Malika Parbat, which is over 17,000 feet (19) and is the highest in the district. On the mountains the grasslands are also found where Gujjars and other nomads migrate

during the summer for grazing by their sheep, goats and other animals. On the north side there are mountains which are the extension of the same mountain system as that of the Kaghan mountains. This range diverges from the eastern side at Musa-ka-Musalla a peak (13,378 feet) (20), which skirt the north end of the Bhogarmang and

Konsh valleys, and sends down a spur to divide the two. Here also, like Kaghan, thick forests are naturally present, especially on the higher slopes. However, due to extensive exploitation, the thick forests are now usually found in the unapproachable areas.

She said the internet is a democratizing force and digital allows equitable access to knowledge provided the affordability of digital infrastructure was enabled and commodities like the internet are not taxed as a luxury item.

She made comparisons between 35% internet penetration in Pakistan to developing countries like Myanmar where it stands at 80% hence policymakers need to start making smartphones and internet access especially in rural areas more affordable and accessible. She further said the AI and the internet of things is improving decision making in multiple areas like affordable healthcare, distance learning
