 ${f P}^{ ext{TI}}$ Chairman Imran Khan's press talk on November 6, 2022 can be regarded as a classic example of politicians' helplessness they have been faced with perhaps ever since the creation of this country. Despite being the head of the leading political party and a former prime minister he has not been able to get his First Information Report registered (FIR). The irony of the fact is that he had to face this unseemly situation in the province where his own party happens to be at the helm of the affairs. The Supreme Court of Pakistan then had to intervene to get the FIR registered albeit it was not the FIR the PTI was looking for. However, after this episode it became quite evident for Imran Khan and his

party that Ch. Pervez Élahi appeared to be the Chief Minister sans authority. Or, he was playing on both sides of the wicket. This also remains a fact the situation was still the same when Imran Khan was the prime minister but since at that time he and his government were enjoying the benevolence of 'powers-that-be' therefore all was considered well. The PTI used to take pride in the fact that it was on the same page with the Establishment, a nexus which, according to it, had brought 'peace and stability' in the country. Now they are at daggers drawn simply because the same page arrangement is not available anymore.

Imran Khan, ever since his ouster, has been selling the idea that he won't accept a weak government and would prefer to sit in the opposition if he does not get a two-thirds majority in the coming elections. Probably, he wants to make a point here that there is no reason in accepting the government if the chief executive has no powers. Here lies a contradiction between what he says and what he actually practices. He had pointed out in his press conference that the actual authority in Punjab lied somewhere else. If it would be a matter of weak control or no authority at all, then the non registration of his FIR was a good excuse for him to call it a day in Puniab. He would have got rid of the Punjab government soon after his own police refused to register his FIR. Ostensibly, his action would have earned him more respect and credibility. But he has not risen to the occasion simply because he knows the success of his long march largely depended upon the Punjab government. If he lost Punjab, it means he lost the trump card, making things difficult for him in terms of holding of early or even on time the general elections. There are some encouraging aspects of Imran Khan's resistance as well. For sure, he will be remembered for putting up stiff resistance to the forces of the status quo. He needs full marks for becoming the voice to those who could never dare to challenge these forces. Many people genuinely believe that something good will come out of what is happening these days. But there is no dearth of people who are of the view that once the 'same page' arrangement stands revived, the forces of status quo shall again prevail and life would then go on as usual. At one point, nobody could even imagine that Nawaz Sharif and his party could come to power again. Same goes for the PPP as well. Both these parties are not just in power but they are sharing power, which is not less than a miracle keeping in view past animosity between these parties. So who knows that in the coming days PTI shall again be calling the shots and PML N and PPP would be on roads demanding justice for them!! Unfortunately this very vicious circle has been impeding Pakistan's march towards self-reliance and progress.

Imran Khan has conditionally agreed to the Prime Minister proposal to constitute a full court commission to probe the Wazirabad firing incident. He is of the view that a fair inquiry cannot take place if three persons he had nominated including the PM, Interior Minister and spy agency official were not removed from their posts. This demand, for sure, will not be acceptable for the government therefore the idea of formation of the full court commission may never see the light of the day. Even if such a commission is formed, there is a strong possibility that the probe will never be completed. The assassination of Benazir Bhutto on December 27, 2007, still remains a mystery despite the fact that her own party remained in power for five years after her murder. The government on its part ought to engage with the PTI seriously and must not try to put out fire

with petrol. This approach would only multiply our woes. A better sense needs to prevail for the country cannot afford any further escalation.

French ambassa briefs media about humanitarian assi

ISLAMABAD: Ambassador of France Nicolas Galey has said following the unprecedented floods that hit Pakistan, the President of the French Republic, Emmanuel Macron, wished to mark the solidarity of France and the French people with the people of

In consultation with the Pakistani authorities, France quickly dispatched emergency equipment and military experts from the French civil security service to the field to assist in relief operations and respond to urgent humanitarian needs.

Ambassador Galey expressed these views while addressing a press conference along with the French Defence Attache Col. A Presson. The ambassador further said, on September 3, a special chartered flight arrived in Karachi, carrving emergency equipment (including 83 high-capacity water pumps and more than 200 tents, as well as other nonfood items) and a military medical team consisting of 4 doctors and 4 nurses, as well as a military team of 4 technicians to operate the water pumps. The



French medical team remained on the ground for two weeks in Badin district in Sindh, working alongside their Pakistani colleagues from the Badin military hospital, to provide hundreds of medical consultations each day. As for the team of trainers, it was able to train more than 50 Pakistani technicians in the use of water pumps.

He said, from October 7 to November

5, 40 French civil security experts were deployed in Dadu district in Sindh to operate water purification equipment brought directly from France. The military team provided 600.000 liters of drinking water to the local communities (1.000 beneficiaries/day). As an indication of support towards the reconstruction of flood-affected areas, France provided a 50-meter-long Bailey-type bridge that will soon be deployed by the Pakistani authorities in Sindh district, he added.

These operations were being carried out within the framework of the European Union Civil Protection Mechanism (EUCPM).

In a further expression of support to flood-affected communities, France allocated 1 million EUR to three French International Non-Governmental Organizations (INGOs) for relief operations for a total of 90.000 beneficiaries in 3 provinces:

• Action Against Hunger (ACF) for an integrated project combining health, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), agriculture, food security and livelihood for close to 30.000 beneficiaries in the districts of Kambar Shadadkot and Khairpur in Sindh;





- Secours Islamique France (SIF) for a multi-sectoral emergency assistance to 40.000 beneficiaries in the districts of Quetta, Killa Saifullah, Pishin and Lasbela, in Balochistan;
- Médecins du Monde (MDM) for the deployment of three mobile health teams, for 20.000 beneficiaries, in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (districts of Nowshera, Charsadda and Chitral). Ambassador Galey said, the French government has also allocated 1 million euros to the World Food Programme (WFP) for an integrated Nutrition - Safety Net Programme for pregnant and lactating women in the districts of Qambar Shahdadkot and Khairpur in Sindh. This programme will

provide emergency food assistance, life-saving nutrition preventive packages, and cash grants to 5.400 direct beneficiaries, and 32.400 household members. Finally, beyond public assistance, a number of French companies also contributed to support flood stricken communities [Total, Bureau Veritas and others] through direct donations or contributions to non-profit organisations to provide immediate support to rehabilitation activities, he concluded. The Defnece Attache Col A Presson in his remarks appreciated the role of Pakistan Army for providing fool proof security to the French humanitarian workers.

Defence Day of Romania celebrated

Romania, Pak coop in defence expanding

Ambassador of Romania Nicolae Goia acknowledged excellent professionalism of the Pakistani army

ISLAMABAD: Ambassador of Romania Nicolae Goia has said Romanian Armed Forces. completely reformed and modernized up to the NATO and European Union standards are assigned to foreign missions, contributing alongside of the allied and partner countries to the common effort of keeping peace and stability worldwide. In compliance with the commitments deriving from the international treaties, agreements and memoranda whose signing party is, Romania had contingents of different sizes from all services - Army, Air and Naval Forces - available to multinational coalitions authorized to carry on peace support, humanitarian assistance, collective or individual operations in the framework of UN, NATO, OSCE and EU-led Observing, Monitoring, Liaison and Training teams.

Ambassador Goia expressed these views while speaking on the occasion of the Armed Forces Day of Romania. He along with Defence Attache Col Cristian Raducu hosted a reception. Mal Gen Fiaz Hussain Shah was the chief guest. The ambassador further said Romania celebrates each year, on October 25th, the Day of the Romanian Army. October 25, 1944, the Romanian Army Day, signifies the date of complete liberation of north-western Transylvania from foreign ruling and administration.

'The liberation of the entire national territory of Romania was achieved by the heroic fights in the World War II of over 525,000 fully employed troops between August 23 and October 25, 1944. Nearly 58,000 of them were killed or injured. Losses incurred on the enemy stood at 89,934 troops, 76,275 of whom were taken prisoners. It is worth mentioning that after 25th of October the Romanian army had continued to fight until the end of the war contributing substantially to the liberation of Hungary and Czechoslovakia'.

Ambassador Goia said, the years of contribution to foreign missions meant for the Romanian Armed Forces the maintenance, almost continuously, of a military force of variable sizes, integrated into UN, OSCE, NATO and EU missions carried out in Africa and Asia. in the theatres of operations in Afghanistan, Iraq and Western Balkans. Almost 40,000 Romanian troops took part in different operations and missions out of national borders, gathering a valuable professional experience extremely useful in the transformation, oper-

























ationalization and interoperability enhancement process of the Romanian Armed Forces with their NATO and EU counterparts.

Romanian Armed forces wisely and skilfully planned their combat forces to fight the war on terror far away from the national borders, proving their capability and determination to fully carry out their missions. Romania remained consistent with its commitments to support the international community in the fight against terror. The contribution of the Romanian troops to the collective defence, peace keeping and restoration missions to enforce the stipulations of the UN Security Council Resolutions, of the international legislation and law reveals that the Romanian state complies consequently and in full faith with the commitments agreed with the allies and partners, according to the international legislation and treaties whose signing party is Romania. He said, unfortunately, we are living in a very complicated security environment. Moreover, Ukraine's security means European and Euro-Atlantic security. In line with the NATO and European Union's policy, Romania stands in full solidarity with the people and government of Ukraine in the heroic defence of their country, helping Ukraine to uphold its fundamental right to self-defence with unprecedented levels of support as a response of Russia's full-scale, brutal, unprovoked and unlawful invasion of Ukraine 'I am very pleased to underline the excellent cooperation existing between Romanian and Pakistani armies which have developed over the years into a true and mutual beneficial partnership. Hungarian National Day reception celebrated in style

Cultural dances leave everybody spell bound; Ambassador Bela Fazekas says Punjab University built by a Hungarian professor

ISLAMABAD: Ambassador of Hungary Bela Fazekas has said on the 23 October 1956 a student protest in Budapest turned into a national uprising for freedom and democracy against communist dictatorship. Two weeks later the Russian aggression crushed the heroic struggle of the freedom fighters. Two hundred thousand Hungarians left the country. Today 66 years later Europe is witnessing another Russian aggression. The Ambassador expressed these views while speaking on the occasion of National Day of Hungary. A large number of diplomats, government functionaries; members of the civil society members attended the event. Federal Minister/Chairman BOI Ch. Salik Hussain was the chief guest. The real feast of the event was a cultural performance by the two young Hungarians artists whose dances left the audience spell-bound. The ambassador further said Hungary and Pakistan established diplomatic relations only in 1965, but people-to-people relations between Hungary and this part of the subcontinent have started much earlier. Not everyone knows in this country that the oldest university of Pakistan, the University of Punjab was founded in 1882 by a Hungarian professor. The cultural and intellectual life of the 19th and early 20th century Lahore would not have been so rich and vibrant without the small community of Hungarian artists, professors, orientalists who lived there. Last year we finished the largest ever Hungarian cultural project in the capital of Punjab, the restoration of eleven paintings of the Sikh gallery painted by a Hungarian artist in the 19th century. Ambassador Fazekas added, Hungary is not a big power. Neither politically, nor economically. But our globally renowned rich cultural heritage, the internationally recognized high quality of our higher education gives us a soft power status. Each year more and more foreign students choose Hungary for their studies, including hundreds of Pakistanis. Currentlynearly 3% of all foreign students in Hungary are from Pakistan. And this percentage is going even higher next year as the Hungarian Government decided to double the number of State Funded scholarships for Pakistan from the current level of 200 to 400.

'Equally important is our economic and commercial cooperation. The frequent mutual visits and meetings between our ministers, parliamentarians, high-ranking military officials provide a solid political basis for enhancement of our economic and trade relations. In fact, our trade has doubled in the last two years. There are more and more Pakistani-Hungarian joint ventures in the field of water management, agriculture and food industry'. He said, the flagship of the Hungarian companies present in Pakistan is the MOL, which is one of the largest foreign investors in the oil and gas industry and the second largest producer of oil in Pakistan. I am very grateful to the MOL Pakistan company, to its management for their gracious sponsorship to the Embassy events including this reception today. A real performance is worth a thousand words and that is why after the speeches he invited the guests to witness very exciting cultural journey with the help of two young Hungarian dancers. Ch. Salik Hussain in his speech thanked the ambassador for inviting him and providing him with an opportunity of sharing his thoughts on the occasion. He said Pakistan values relations with Hungary adding these relations would continue to grow even in the coming days.

UN Security Council adopted 4 resolutions demanding immediate and unconditional withdrawal of Armenian troops from our territories but these resolutions were never implemented.2 years ago, in 2020 under the leadership of the Supreme Commander-in-Chief of the Azerbaijani Armed Forces, President Ilham Aliyev, our army liberated Azerbaijan's territories from Armenian occupation and Armenia was forced to sign an act of capitulation, thus acknowledging Azerbaijan's historic victory. Azerbaijan ensured its territorial integrity, and the fundamental rights of nearly one million displaced Azerbaijanis were restored.

He said everything was razed into ground, cities and villages, buildings, historical monuments, 65 out of 67 mosques was destroyed by Armenia during the times of occupation. Even the graveyards were desecrated, destroyed, and looted.

Right after the liberation, Azerbaijan started large-scale restoration and reconstruction works in the liberated areas. France allocates 1 mn **EUR** for flood victims

ISLAMABAD: France has allocated 1 million EUR to three French International Non-Governmental Organisations for humanitarian relief operations for flood-hit communities in Pakistan. These relief activities will provide critical assistance to vulnerable households, and contribute to reducing loss of lives and improving living conditions in flood-affected communities. France's financial assistance

been earmarked for the following relief operations:Action Against Hunger (ACF), for an integrated project combining health, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), agriculture, food security and livelihood for approximately 30 000 beneficiaries in the districts of Kambar Shadadkot and Khairpur in Sindh. The project will include the deployment of a healthcare clinic, the distribution of hygiene kits, the building of semi-permanent latrines, the rehabilitation of water supply schemes, and the provision of livestock kits and seeds.

Secours Islamique - France (SIF), for a multi-sectoral emergency assistance to 40 000 beneficiaries in the districts of Quetta, Killa Saifullah, Pishin and Lasbela, in Balochistan. The project will include the distribution of food packs and shelter kits, the rehabilitation of water supply systems, the distribution of hygiene kits and school kits, and the distribution of fodder and medicines for livestock, and the distribution of seeds and agricultural inputs for agricultural land rehabilitation.

Médecins du Monde (MDM), for the deployment of three mobile health teams, for 20 000 beneficiaries, in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (districts of Nowshera, Charsadda and Chitral). The project will include the provision of primary health care services,

medical equipment, and medicines.

French Ambassador, Nicolas Galey, said: "French international non-governmental organisations, together with their Pakistani partners, play an essential role in providing humanitarian assistance to floodaffected communities.

The French government is pleased to support Action against Hunger, Secours Islamique - France and Médecins du Monde in their relief operations. This financial support builds on other support provided by France, including the mission in September of a French medical team, the distribution of high-capacity water pumps, the provision of emergency equipment (tents, kitchen sets...), the current French civil security-led water purification operation in Dadu district. and the procurement of a portable bridge in the coming weeks", he added.

ISLAMABAD: "Our sustained and continuous efforts of raising awareness regarding breast cancer are yielding results, as women in far-flung areas of the country are becoming aware of the deadliness of breast cancer, since a rise in early-stage breast cancer detection is being reported in health care centres all over Pakistan.' These remarks were expressed by the Honourable First Lady of Pakistan, Begum Samina Alvi; an active advocate for breast cancer awareness, during her keynote address at a high-profile panel discussion on Breast Cancer Awareness hosted by Serena Hotels under the banner of Raabta - a Public Diplomacy initiative.

Raabta is curated by renowned broadcast journalist Sidra Iqbal, and uses the convening power of Serena Hotels to bring thought leaders, policymakers, experts, and the civil society together to advance debate and curate knowledge about important socio-economic topics. The experts on the panel included Dr. Ayesha Isani Majeed, Head of Radiology Department and Incharge Federal Breast Cancer Screening Center at the Pakistan Institute for Medical Sciences (PIMS); Dr. Abida K. Sattar, Head of Breast Surgery at the Aga Khan University Hospital Karachi; Ms. Shireen Gheba an author, blogger, painter, and a cancer survivor, diagnosed in 2021 who is now cancer free; and Mr. Aizaz Chaudary, the Director of Institute of Strategic Studies and former Foreign Secretary of Pakistan, who is also a male survivor of breast cancer.

With 2.3 million diagnoses in 2020, breast cancer is the most common cancer in women and the second most common cause of cancer-related deaths in women worldwide. Pakistan has the highest prevalence of breast cancer in Asia, with 1 out of 6 women expected to be diagnosed with the disease at some point in their lives. The honourable First Lady appreciated the efforts of Serena Hotels for annually organising awareness sessions for the public, though the utilisation of the Raabta Platform, as it has a valuable outreach and the discussion of the experts and cancer warriors is indeed an inspiration for all. Sidra Iqbal remarked that with 90,000 women being diagnosed with breast cancer every year and the high death rate from the disease, indicates a dire need to break the cultural and traditional barriers to disease prevention and cure.

Dr. Ayesha Isani Majeed stressed that yearly mammograms for women over 40 and regular breast self-examinations should become a part of women's self-care routine. She informed that the Federal Breast Cancer Screening Centre at PIMS is the first public sector facility in Islamabad which offers initial screening and detection, biopsy, ultrasound and mammography to patients under one ceiling, and was built to facilitate the growing demand of patients especially those unable to afford the costs of private hospitals. Dr. Isani also spoke of the need to create support groups for those suffering from the disease as the willpower to fight the disease played a major role in recovery. Mr. Aizaz Chaudhary said that there was a need to target men in awareness campaigns by distributing pamphlets and informational material. Sharing his personal experience, he said he faced a delay in diagnosis due to the ignorance related to the prevalence of male breast cancer. Dr. Abida K. Sattar from the Aga Khan University Hospital said that the disease is often hereditary, and it has nothing to do with the character of a woman as surmised by some ignorant segments.

travelling all around the country to reach Pakistani youth in various universities across the country and offer a window into the strong connection between the EU and Pakistan.



Along this River, We are All One

BOUT 5,000 years ago, a civilization budded along the coast of the River Indus - also known as the Indus Valley Civilization. Over the course of thousands of years, this civilization expanded and grew; however, it stands true even today that before matters like caste and creed came into existence, there was only one thing uniting everyone: A river and a sense of belonging to it.

As the prodigy of a civilization that lived harmoniously under one united name, preserving monuments that exhibit this harmony is essential. One prime example is that of the Katas Raj temples near Chakwal; a manifesto of cultures from the 7th century that is now in ruin. Apart from the Hindu temples and Buddhist stupas present there, the site is best known for the lake that exists at its heart. I had the opportunity to not only see this lake - which according to a fascinating myth was formed when Shiva, the God of Destruction wept over the death of his wife Sati - but also research its chemical composition to check its impurity. To this day, the lake acts as a religious and cultural nexus for the Hindu, Buddhist, and Sikh communities. Even after thousands of years, the temples are a sustainable architectural masterpiece with a flux of cultures and influences incorporated into their construction. All the temples at the site can be divided into two categories. Firstly, the ones that have been directly influenced by the Gandhara tradition. Secondly, those that have been inspired by the Kashmiri temples whose chief characteristics were dentils, trefoil arches, fluted pillars, and pointed roofs. Most of these temples were in a very ruined condition, built of soft friable sandstone which was crumbling away.

The remains of the temples also form an important link in the history of this region and South Asian temple architecture. The temples have plain masonry walls and cantoned corner pilasters, and the sub-shrines are elevated to form a series of cornices with tiny intermediate rows of pillars and a crowning ribbed dome. The picture on the left below shows the Hanuman Temple which has been largely influenced by Kashmiri architecture and is undecorated and lime-plastered. It houses a series of rock stairs that cover three storeys and lead to a roof (shown on the right). The roof offers a spectacular view of the police station made during the British era and shows its relatively modern architecture. But its most unique architectural characteristic is the presence of a lake at the very center of the temples whilst keeping the construction safe from damage due to water. This was made possible because the mandirs and balconies, as well as the pillars made to support them, were made purely from piled-up stone. This, along with the limestone domed roofs that prevented the accumulation of rainwater, shows the sustainable design of the complex.

The site is also famous for the Sat Ghara - meaning the seven temples that have been dedicated to different Hindu deities. These include the Ramchandra Temple, Hanuman Temple, Shiva Temple, etc which have been used as worship places by pilgrims over the years. These temples can be approached via a set of limestone stairs that have been







recently added. Out of the seven temples comprising the Sat Ghara, only four are left and are open to tourists now. The remarkable architectural design calls for a further approach to sustainable restoration to utilize the vast potential the site has for tourism. Restoration projects for the temples have been initiated twice now, once in 2006 when the Deputy Prime Minister of India, Advani, visited the temple complex, and secondly in 2017 under Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif. The picture below on the left shows the limestone stairs that were recently added. On the left, colorful designs on the roof of the Ramachandra temple are shown.

The Katas Raj Temples showcase the shared culture and heritage of a variety of groups. However, the distortion of the understanding of shared cultural monuments due to biases has caused a step back from the very river that links us. And I wonder, if we had abandoned the River Indus all those 5,000 years ago and focused on our individual differences, where would we be today?

Highlighting the objectives of the agreements, the envoy said the parties to the accord had agreed to a "permanent cessation of hostilities" to ensure a conducive environment for laying the foundation of sustainable peace. He said the accord's salient features also included restoration of the Constitutional order across the country, implementation of political solutions for the political problems, provision of a framework to address matters arising out of the conflict and their accountability, reconciliation and rehabilitation of social bonds, commitment to address the underlying political differences and formulation of a framework for monitoring and verification of its (accord) implementation. He said the parties to the accord would be bound to respect territorial integrity, sovereignty, human rights, democratic and constitutional norms and above all the unity of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia. H.E. Jemal Beker said unhindered access to the all-in



need of humanitarian assistance, the use of humanitarian aid for humanitarian purposes, and respect for the African Charter of Democracy, elections and governance were also among the other provisions of agreement.

He said under the agreement, the permanent cessa-

tion of hostilities would not only be limited to ending the armed aggression but also required cessation of all forms of hostile propaganda, rhetoric and hate speech. H.E. Jemal also expressed gratitude for the people of friendly countries who stood by the Ethiopian nation and extended unwavering support for ensuring peace, sovereignty and territorial integrity of Ethiopia which opened a new chapter in ensuring Ethiopia's stability and prosperity. The ambassador said it has been agreed in the agreement to restore the federal authority in the Tigray region including control of the federal institutions and agencies by the Ethiopian government. He said the agreement was a major breakthrough which would help the current Ethiopian government in carrying out the reforms crucial to transform the country into a modern prosperous state.

The empire of two capitals

HEREAS most great nations have built singular capitals whose ethos has guided national narratives and designed national strategy, some powers have instead had "two capitals" that operate on conflicting and competing logics. Beijing, for example, is the singular capital of the People's Republic of China, and it thus drives both the geostrategic and geoeconomic objectives of the Chinese state in a concerted, harmonious manner. In other words, the economic community and the security community in China are of one mind, enabling them to conduct effective "geoeconomics," which is a function of both strategy and economics executed in tandem.

The United States, by contrast, has "two capitals" that proceed from conflicting logical premises. It has what we might call the "New York community" (i.e. Wall Street) that is driven by a market-based logic of cointegrating economies and generating profits, but it also has the Washingtonian "DC Crowd" which operates on traditional hard-security lines. The NY Crowd is driven by titans such as Goldman Sachs and JP Morgan, while the DC Crowd draws upon institutions such as the State Department and the Pentagon.

During the Cold War, it was the DC Crowd that maintained primacy in directing US policy, arguing from a siege-mentality for competition with Moscow for the preservation of security and hegemony, and fighting through proxies across the entire world as a battlefield. Thanks to help from Pakistan and some other countries, the DC crowd emerged triumphant in the early 1990s, having cemented a monumental effort into achieving a unipolar world at the mercy of a victorious empire. At that point, however, the New York crowd stepped in more forcefully in directing US policy, and it argued that, since we had arrived at the "end of history," it would be important for an economics-led prism to guide the US in the century ahead. This is because an economicorientation would assure (their) prosperity and keep a "soft power" leash on the world, which would be far more palatable, and far less expensive, as an instrument of empire. With respect to what was then seen as the next big threat (China), the New York crowd pacified the DC folk by continually arguing that Peking would follow in the footsteps of Taipei and Seoul, which is to say that economic cooperation and investment would come first, and in time Peking would come around to the American way of thinking (free-market capitalism and Western-style democracy). Truly, Taipei and Seoul were governed by authoritarian right-wing regimes in the mid-20th century, but through economic development they shed those hard skins and became genteel democracies and bastions of capitalism. even surpassing the United States in terms of "prosperity" along certain metrics. The NY crowd thus had a credible template, and steered the American public away from the intergenerational fatigue of Cold War adversarialism. American companies then poured enormous investment in China, building up a vast manufacturing base that was complemented by managerial expertise, transfers of technology (ToT), and the acculturation of business best-practices.

China in turn further opened up and became the largest untapped market for capitalist surplus production, gobbling up everything that foreign tastes could satiate. For most American multinationals, China became the single biggest driver of profits and earningsper-share, thus generating enormous bonuses for the New York executives who chomped on fat cigars and boasted to investors about their "China exposure" in quarterly earnings calls. When I worked on the buy-side (global asset management), my single biggest question to investor relations teams and executives was on their exposure to the Chinese market. This factor would drive my financial modeling, and help determine my judgment on the future path of multinationals in question. China was simply the main story - indeed, the only story; and New York was smitten with China's wonderful economic future. However, the mood began to change after 2016, when Donald Trump was elected US President, and his administration began to levy hefty penalties on China, including trade sanctions and other measures inimical to economic cooperation and mutual benefit. The Trump administration had come to realize that China's economy was well on its way to surpass the United States by 2030, and yet, it hadn't followed the same path as Seoul or Taipei. It still had the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), which was largely admired by the Chinese people for its transformative economic policies that offered a clear-cut counternarrative to the American model of economic and social development. China had

accomplished the single greatest economic miracle in human history, lifting 700 million people out of poverty within two generations, a feat that took the West far longer to achieve, and of course the West was receding into decline in any case.

By this point, the DC crowd had forcefully challenged the New York folk who had grown fat on the riches of commerce with China. They pointed out that China had a strengthening array of both hard and soft power assets, and if timely action isn't taken, the American Empire would fade from view without even firing a shot at China. The NY Crowd had taken two decades to realize their proposal of converting Peking into its acolyte, but instead China was already chipping away America's primacy, and that too on the back of American technological, managerial, and material largesse!

Since then, even as the Trump administration failed to be re-elected, the Biden administration has pursued an equally harsh, if not harsher, approach against China. The DC crowd and its Cold War mentality are back in full swing, and the New York crowd is today both embarrassed by the shortcomings in attaining their final objective, and by increasing diatribe against their winnings from engagement with China. A flurry of recent books has demanded accountability from Wall Street for making so much money by helping China to rise, while leaving the American worker in the dust and American economy in shambles (particularly after Covid-19).

This is the drawback of an empire with two capitals: they may follow competing (and contradictory) approaches towards maintaining hegemony, and may come to blows as the zenith of the empire wanes and its power begins to fade. There are, however, many sympathetic voices that still argue for a cooperative approach between the US and China, not just within New York, Peking, and even some Washington; but also from around the world as countries attempt a tenuous balancing act between two titans. However, the voice that argues for international economic cooperation, sadly, is being drowned out, and the world will pay a heavy price as the DC folk relegate the NY folk to ignominy.


