Economic and political crises



T HE September 2, 2023 strike, organized by Jamaat-e-Islami in response to the alarming surge in petrol and electricity prices, can be hailed as an unequivocal success. The overwhelming participation resulted in the closure of a majority of businesses, sending a powerful message. Although such widespread protests and strikes may not immediately sway the rulers, they undeniably lay the groundwork for more frequent and impactful demonstrations in the future. The nation has experienced a series of economic and political challenges in recent years. These challenges can be traced back to the moment when Nawaz Sharif was removed from office through a court order, a decision that many perceived as being based on tenuous legal grounds. It's important to clarify

that this doesn't absolve the Sharif family of corruption allegations. Over the years, they have accumulated significant wealth during their tenures in both provincial and central government positions. However, what stood out was the sentencing of Nawaz Sharif in a case that had not previously been discussed or debated at any stage, raising questions about the fairness and transparency of the legal process. The primary catalyst for his removal ostensibly stemmed from his deteriorating relationship with the Establishment of the time. He had probably become 'unmanageable' hence he has to be removed. Then in 2018 the project Imran Khan was launched with this hope that he shall behave and remain within his limits. The relationship worked well for the initial two years nevertheless things started getting bad and then from bad to worse when Imran Khan tried to fly independently. His wings were consequently clipped and a hotchpotch type government was put in place to run the day to day affairs. Regrettably, this government proved to be a resounding failure, causing significant harm to the country's economic and political landscape. The leader of this government Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif dissolved the National Assembly few days before the stipulated term in order to get maximum time for electioneering.

The paramount concern remains: will there be sustained economic and political stability, regardless of whether the elections are conducted within the next 90 days or later? Regrettably, the outlook for our nation's political and economic future appears far from promising. The treatment meted out to certain political parties, their leaders, and their supporters speaks loudly of a dismal political trajectory for our country. The establishment of a government through gerrymandering and political maneuvers is destined to exacerbate our existing challenges. In the recent past, we have witnessed similar scenarios with both the PTI and PDM governments, and these experiences have only compounded our difficulties. In contemplating the future prospects of the three leading contenders vying for the coveted position of Prime Minister – Nawaz Sharif, Shehbaz Sharif, and Imran Khan

the coveted position of Prime Minister – Nawaz Sharif, Shehbaz Sharif, and Imran Khan – the ever-changing political landscape implies that all three might not necessarily be in contention for the highest office. Just as the caretaker prime minister can be surprising, the permanent prime minister might also catch people off guard. Nawaz Sharif, in particular, faces a challenging journey if he wishes to reenter the race. His foremost obstacle appears to be his legal sentence and his relationship with the Establishment. For many observers, it seems that he has yet to gain the confidence of the establishment, primarily due to his previous stances towards the institution and its officials. Shehbaz Sharif, often referred to as Shehbaz Speed, faced significant challenges during his one and a half-year tenure as the country's leader, which unfortunately did not result in effective governance. His leadership period appeared to multiply Pakistan's existing problems rather than resolving them. The once-promising image of a 'reformer' and 'do-gooder,' carefully cultivated during his time as Punjab's chief minister, quickly faded when he took on the role of prime minister. This experience, marked by a lack of success and impact, raises doubts about whether the powers-that-be would be inclined to repeat such a leadership choice in the future. Pakistan happens to be a land of miracles, however no miracle is expected to occur in case of Imran Khan. Even if he decides to follow 'his master voice' even then his chances to become the prime minister any time soon are dim. Those who are close to him staunchly believe, what sets him apart from other politicians

is his 'unwavering' commitment to his 'principles', whereas many of his peers tend to pivot their stance opportunistically for personal gain.

On this auspicious occasion, I extend my warmest felicitations to all the Indonesians residing in Pakistan and across the globe. "Moving Forward for an Advanced Indonesia" is the theme of this year's independence celebrations reflecting the strong desire for a prosperous and resilient Indonesia as envisioned by our founding fathers. Freedom is the most important treasure of any nation together with stability, unity and continuing collective economic growth. Indonesia has strong commitments to upholding democratic values and protection of human rights to promote prosperity and social justice to all Indonesians. In celebrating this special day together, the whole Indonesian nation renews its dedication to move ahead together for more progress and unity.

At present, Indonesia is the world's third largest democracy and a progressive democratic country among the Muslim world where Islam, democracy and modernity coexist peacefully. Under the leadership of President Joko Widodo, Indonesia pursues an active foreign policy with an inclusive approach to promote fair and just international order, respect to national integrity and international law. This year Indonesia holds the ASEAN Chairmanship. This diverse region with a population of more than 650 million has achieved remarkable economic growth. ASEAN's combined GDP is now the fifth largest in the world. The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) which entered into force on 1 January 2022 makes ASEAN, together with 5 dialogue partners, one of the world's biggest trade area that contributes to 30.2 percent of global GDP, 27 percent of global trade, and 29 percent of Foreign Direct Investment. RCEP will eventually strengthen regional integration and enhance a favourable environment for better trade relations in the Indo-Pacific region and beyond.

As regards bilateral diplomatic relations between Indonesia and Pakistan, it is heartening to note that both countries have achieved many significant milestones after gaining independence. Our bilateral relations are a fine example of multi-dimensional constructive engagement and productive cooperation. Economic progress and political stability have always been the priority of our top leadership. Both the countries have a combined Muslim population of around 500 million, strong democracies and enjoy important geo-strategic positions in their regions with a lot of religious and cultural similarities. The story of our progressive bilateral relationship remains incomplete without highlighting the significant contribution of Indonesian founding father President Soekarno. President Soekarno laid the groundwork for strong bilateral ties with his four

successive visits, warmth of goodwill and unconditional support for Pakistan. President Soekarno was also an active promotor of intensive cooperation among the developing countries and hosted the Asian-African Conference in Bandung in 1955 which served as antecedent for the establishment of the Non Aligned Movement. UNESCO adopted in May 2023, archives of President Soekarno's speech at the 15th session of UNGA titled "To Build the World Anew" as a Memory of the World (MoW). This will complete the other two MoW previously adopted by UNESCO: the golden archives of the Bandung Asian-African Conference of 1955 and the First Non-Aligned Movement in Belgrade of 1961.

History and tradition brings Indonesia and Pakistan closer together. The keen interest and efforts to promote bilateral ties by President Soekarno served as a profound basis for the advancement of close ties, supported by a number of bilateral agreements in all areas of mutual interests. Today, our partnership encompasses cooperation in a wide spectrum of areas including in the political, economic, education, defence, science and technology, culture and tourism realms. The Joint Ministerial Committee was established last year, paving the way to a more structural engagement to our bilateral relations. The two countries have been in close consultation to also revisit the 2013 Preferential Trade Agreement with the objective to expand trade and commercial activities.

With these positive developments, I am certain that the future holds an expansion and deepening of our friendly bonds and collaboration, people-to-people ties and commitment to remain actively engaged at bilateral and multilateral levels. We look forward to working closely with the Government and people of Pakistan as well as the Indonesian-Pakistani diaspora on both sides towards meeting this objective. It is my sincere hope that Indonesia-Pakistan will harvest even more achievements, which can be achieved by maintaining this dynamic momentum cooperation across all fields.

Remembering President Soekarno and His Legacy

Soekarno, the first President of the Republic of Indonesia, was an internationally acclaimed world leader, who is still remembered and respected for his significant contribution in promoting world peace with his progressive views and vision. Soekarno's vision, determination and dynamic energy inspired not only Indonesians but people around the world. He was a born leader and legacy of his struggle for Indonesia's independence is still significant in the present era.



UNESCO Recently, designated has Soekarno's famous speech titled "To Build the World Anew' as the Memory of the World (MoW) because of its historic significance in 2023. Mav The speech was delivered at the annual session of the 15th UN General Assembly in 1960 and made a

great impact on the global stage.

Born in 1901, Soekarno was a founding father of Indonesia, who spearheaded his nation to independence and became the first President of the Republic of Indonesia. As a visionary statesman, revolutionary politician, staunch nationalist and freedom fighter, he earned huge respect and admiration both in Indonesia and among the international community. Soekarno was widely acknowledged by the world as a strong supporter of independence movements around the world and successfully challenged domination of colonial powers at that time.

In that speech, President Soekarno underscored the importance of equality, respect of sovereignty and territorial integrity among states disregarding their size or their respective socio-economic development. He also urged the UN to undertake reform process for improving its functioning as a global representative institution and to create fair opportunities for the newly independent states to take part in contributing to the world's peace and security. Soekarno's bold statements were ahead of his time. Fast forward to today's world, the issue of the reformation of the UN as global institution remains relevant regardless of how the context and geopolitical circumstances have altered since 1960. It was the UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan, who in 1997 launched a more consistent approach to initiate the reform of the organization through Track One and Track Two reform proposals.

to Build Strong Foundation for Indonesia-Pakistan Relationship

In his statement at the 15th Annual Session of UNGA, President Soekarno also introduced the national philosophy and

ideology of Indonesia known as PANCASILA which captures universal values: (1) Belief in one God (2) Just and civilized humanity (3) Unity of Indonesia (4) Den



of Indonesia (4) Democracy (5) Social justice.

Simultaneously, he reminded the international; community to remain vigilant in addressing global injustice and respecting fundamental freedom and human rights.

Soekarno the founding father of Indonesia

Soekarno's dynamic leadership and oratory skills helped mobilize and unite the diverse Indonesian population in their quest for independence. His strong sense of nationalism and dedication to the cause of Indonesian independence inspired millions making him the country's first truly national figure. He was a graduate from Bandung Institute of Technology in civil engineering and his political activities began in his early years at the university. He was one of the prominent student leaders, who advocated independence from the Dutch occupation and a member of the Indonesian National Party. The late 1920s witnessed the rise of Soekarno to a position of prominence among political leaders. During his rise to power, Soekarno didn't fight with guns but with his brain, his writings, and most important of them all his charisma that manifested in his roaring speeches.

Indonesia is a multicultural nation with over 17,000 islands and diverse ethnic and religious groups. Therefore, the founding father of Indonesia Soekarno wisely devised the state ideology of Pancasila that encompassed the country's diverse society. The principles enshrined in five principles of Pancasila also provided basis to Indonesia's National Motto "Bhinneka Tunggal Ika", meaning Unity in Diversity. Soekarno's vision of Indonesia as a democratic country with pluralistic communities was comparable to Quad-i-Azam's vision of Pakistan as a democratic and inclusive country where people from all backgrounds and religions could live in peace. Both of the country's founding fathers strongly supported social justice, economic prosperity for all citizens, and the value of national unity and tolerance.

Soekarno and Non Aligned Movement (NAM)

At the international arena, one of Soekarno's most significant accomplishment was hosting Asian-African (Bandung) Conference held on 18-24 April 1955 in Indonesia. The Conference brought together leaders from 29 Asian and African countries to promote decolonization process and to raise voice against imperialism. The 1955 conference marked the first summit-level meeting of the leaders of Asia and Africa and served the antecedent to the creation of the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) - a movement advocating for decolonization and strengthening relations between newly independent countries by expressing neutrality in light of the Cold War rivalries. their The Conference in Bandung produced Asian-African fundamental principles governing interstate relations which are still considered important. 'The Ten Principles of Bandung' was a political statement containing basic principles that would guide the efforts of developing countries to promote peace and cooperation in the world. Even today, the Conference's intellectual and political legacy of Soekarno, holds great significance for developing countries, sparking and stimulating regional initiatives for solidarity of Asia and African Union and

South-South cooperation. The leaders of the Joint Secretariat who played important role in the success of Asian-African Conference (KAA).

Soekarno's commitment to the struggle for independence for countries in Asia and Africa was one of the main foundations that formed the basis of Indonesia's diplomatic strategy in achieving strong foreign policy goals. Asian-African Conference in Bandung (1955) is part of Indonesia's diplomatic strategy to strengthen its role and influence at the international level and help create a more just and equitable global political atmosphere. As a prominent figure in Non-Aligned Movement (NAM), Soekarno advocated for maintaining neutrality and independence from the Western and Eastern blocs during the Cold War. Following the vision of Soekarno, the Non-Align Movement (NAM) is central to Indonesia's foreign policy and focuses on issues such as disarmament, economic development and achieving Sustainable Development Goals, poverty alleviation, establishing a just world order and international peace and stability.

New momentum to galvanize Global South cooperation was seized during the 50th anniversary of the Bandung Conference of Asian-African by the adoption of the Declaration of the New Asian-African Strategic Partnership (NAASP) in 2005. Furthermore. the 60th anniversary of the Bandung Conference of Asian-African

was held in 2016 hosted by President Joko Widodo.

Today, Non-Aligned Movement has become the largest forum worldwide after the United Nations consisting 120 member states and representing almost 55% of the world population. NAM continues to become a positive power amid global geopolitical dynamics. It guides member states to work together to promote unity and cooperation between the Global South (developing countries) based on mutual interest, to preserve international peace and security and to realize social-justice in international economic system.


Soekarno's active role in strengthening Indonesia-Pakistan ties



Indonesia and Pakistan cherish strong bonds of friendship marked with lot of historic, religious and cultural similarities. These fraternal relations even precede the birth of the two countries as both the nations stood with each other during their respective freedom struggles. Soekarno, as a charismatic figure and proclaimer of the independence of the Republic of Indonesia, had a very significant role in forming and strengthening diplomatic relations between Indonesia and Pakistan. On 17 August 1945. when Sukarno proclaimed Indonesia's independence from the Netherlands, then-President of All India Muslim League, Quaid Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah called on the Muslim units of the British Colonial Army stationed in the Far East to unite with their Indonesian compatriots against the Dutch colonial aggression. The participation of some 600 Muslim soldiers from the Indo-Pakistan subcontinent in the Indonesian War of Independence remains a glorious chapter in the history of both countries.

Around 500 soldiers gallantly sacrificed their lives during the war and they are remembered with respect by both nations as heroes. Later, Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah's personal connection to the Indonesian freedom struggle again manifested further when he ordered to restrain a Dutch plane at Karachi airport carrying supplies for the colonial army in Jakarta. The successive meetings between Soekarno and Pakistani leaders right after the independence had been the starting point of a productive relationship between the two countries. With progressive political views and an anti-colonial spirit, Soekarno sought to strengthen relations with Pakistan and other countries in South Asia. This successful effort was marked by the opening of diplomatic relations between the two countries in 1950. This journey, from the period of the struggle for independence to the present day, is full of important moments that mark cooperation, solidarity, and friendship between the two nations.



On 17 August 1995, Indonesia celebrated the golden jubilee of its independence and honored Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah with the highest Civil Award of "ADIPURA" and granted Independence War Awards to the living ex-Pakistani soldiers in recognition of their role and contribution to the independence of Indonesia.

President Soekarno visited Pakistan four times during his tenure in office, in 1950, 1953, 1958 and 1963. During this period. President İskandar Mirza and President Ayub Khan visited Indonesia in 1958 and in 1960



respectively. President Soekarno was also the first Indonesian president to address the Pakistani Parliament on June 26, 1963.

The frequent interaction of President Soekarno with the top leaders of Pakistan has great historical significance for as it laid the foundation of close cooperation and strong bilateral ties based on shared history and values, mutual trust and common interests. Following the establishment of the Indonesian Embassy in Karachi on January 23, 1950, the two countries sealed the Treaty of Friendship in Jakarta on April 21, 1953 and signed the Protocol to the Trade Agreement between the Government of Indonesia and the Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Jakarta, January 11, 1965. Soekarno's efforts to promote economic ties between Indonesia and Pakistan exemplified his commitment to fostering solidarity among newly independent nations and establishing strong international relations.

Tributes to President Soekarno

Soekarno was considered by his fellow countrymen and global citizens as a progressive leader who was persistent in his pursuit of independence and justice, both on a national and international level. His pivotal role in founding the Non-Aligned Movement, which helped developing nations preserve their neutrality and fight against pressure from major blocs in international politics, earned him high honors. Many countries in the South have paid tribute to Sukarno for his efforts to promote independence and liberation from colonialism. Soekarno Streets in Phnom Penh, Cambodia; Cairo, Egypt; Ankara, Turkey; Rabat, Morocco;

Following President Soekarno's visits to Pakistan, high-level visits between the two countries kept on increasing. With the exception of the third Indonesian President, B.J. Habibie, all successive Indonesian presidents had visited Pakistan reflecting the importance which Indonesia attaches to Pakistan as a trusted friend. In this connection, President Joko Widodo's state visit to Pakistan in 2018 was a historic moment that gave new momentum to the two countries' bilateral relations. More structural relationship is also envisioned with the establishment of Joint Ministerial Commission (JMC) by Indonesian Foreign Minister Retno Marsudi and Foreign Minister of Pakistan Bilawal Bhutto in December last year.

In recognition of his continuous efforts for freedom from colonialism and equal rights, many countries in the world have paid tribute to Sukarno in the form of different monuments. Soekarno Streets in Phnom Penh, Cambodia; Cairo, Egypt; Ankara, Turkey; Rabat, Morocco; Soekarno Drive in Dili, Timor Leste; and Soekarno Crescent in Ottawa, Canada are just a few examples. Three monuments of Soekarno have also been built in Algeria, Mexico and Pakistan, as an expression of respect for Soekarno's role and contribution for the cause of developing countries in the South.

Soekarno Square in Khyber Bazaar in Peshawar, Soekarno Bazaar in Lahore and Soekarno Tower in Larkana are symbols of friendship and acknowledgment of his great contribution in developing exemplary fraternal ties between Indonesia and Pakistan. Moreover, Indonesia-Pakistan historic connections and cultural similarities have further strengthened the growing bilateral ties.

Despite being geographically apart, there are many of aspects each culture that are closely related. The influence of Islamic faith and tradition, rich art and music, delicious food and unique customs are some of the elements that bring people of our two brotherly countries emotionally and spiritually together.

Ethiopia's remarkable journey towards a double-digit economy is a testament to the transformative power of reforms initiated in 2018. With focused efforts to address bottlenecks in FDI, trade, and business services, progress is evident across pivotal sectors such as agriculture, manufacturing, mining, tourism, and ICT. A shared commitment to combat climate change has united our nations. Ethiopia's Green Legacy Initiative, conceived by Prime Minister Dr. Abiy Ahmed, stands as a beacon of hope and launched here in Pakistan by the FDRE Embassy. Having witnessed Pakistan's vulnerability firsthand during the devastating flood of 2022. I embarked on a mission to distribute relief items to affected regions, a memory etched forever in my heart.

Jaranwala incident moving beyond condemnation

N a single day on 16 August 2023, around 19 churches in Jaranwala were ransacked. The mob rampaged through the prominent Christian areas of the city to accomplish its dastardly mission, which had begun on the pretext of defiling of Holy Quran by two Christian brothers. The vigilante mob had gathered strength from the neighborhood by playing into their religious emotions that demanded that an act of blasphemy be responded to with equal force. According to the report, an announcement was made through a mosque calling upon the faithful to take revenge not from the two brothers who were blamed for desecrating Quran but from their entire community-from its children, its women, and its elders. In no time, the city was engulfed in hatred emanating from a story that had neither been investigated nor reported to the police. Unfortunately, by the time the police took control of the situation, the damage had been done. If reports from the crime scene are to be believed, the police allowed the game of hate to take place without intervention. Moreover, like always, not until the news broke out on national media did the police gather muscle to make a foray.

Until now, hundreds of miscreants have been hauled up, along with the two brothers blamed for dishonoring Quranic pages. The Jaranwala incident is part of a series of violent acts perpetrated on minorities in the name of religion. The way the drama unfolded, it is convenient to blame the external forces to have manipulated the event to nudge Pakistan towards a failed state emblem

further. I cannot rule out the probability that Pakistan's foes, both within and without, may have scripted this bloody theatre. However, I cannot also turn my sight away from the failure of Pakistan as a state to prevent such incidents from happening, either.

As part of the Pakistan Ulema Council's mission to strengthen interfaith harmony in Pakistan, we hurriedly managed to contain the situation from spilling further. We rallied Christian leadership from across Pakistan and jointly condemned the incident.

We resolved not to allow such incidents to sever our relations as one nation-Christians and Muslims. However, this is a patchwork that we, as the propeller of interfaith harmony, have been doing whenever such a situation arises. The real work is to originate from the state. Only then will we be able to end such incidents? The unforgivable part of this entire story is the ease with which the people's religious feelings were manipulated, just like it was easy to manipulate their religious sentiments four decades back. We have not progressed in building character in our nation. Would I be wrong to assert that this country is a group of people lacking a common objective that helps in character building? When the Army Public School incident occurred, the state assigned itself the duty to address not the symptoms-terror-related incidents-but the cause-extremism-in society. The awakening to this realization was formulated into a National Action Plan. It was a 20-point agenda agreed upon by all the political and religious parties and fringe elements as an appropriate policy response to thrust back the rising tides of terrorism. Under the plan, a constitutional amendment was made to allow the Pakistan army to trial the terrorists in the military courts with an apparent objective of turning the wheel of justice in the right direction. Many terrorists were hanged to death; terror financing was chocked, proscribed organizations were restricted from raising themselves in new attire; registration and regulation of religious seminaries were carried out with effective results: FATA was merged into KP. the use of social media in terror assistance was stemmed, militancy in Punjab was brought down, Karachi operation


was completed successfully with the result that target killing was reduced to zero, sectarian violence had almost diminished, though belatedly NACTA was revived. The dissemination of hate material through newspapers, media, and other sources was controlled, and the media was restricted from giving airtime to terror-related activities. I must say that Pakistan. Army did a tremendous job assisting the civilian government in lending wings to the NAP. Nevertheless, despite all the successes, our failure to revamp the criminal justice system of Pakistan-one of the 20 points NAP agenda-had rendered weak the entire edifice of the National Action Plan.

The criminal justice system is a formation of multiple pillars, such as academia, law enforcement, forensic services, the judiciary, and corrections. They support the idea of legal justice to protect the citizens' life and property and ensure the implementation of law and order. Since the Jaranwala incident, I have repeatedly said that had we tried and given exemplary punishment to the culprits of the Goira and Joseph colony incident, we might have stopped vet another attack on minorities.

I would urge the government of Pakistan to focus on creating a system whereby people are educated about blasphemy and how it should be approached. Training people on how to react if their religious sentiments are attacked is required. Congregational setups such as Juma pravers and church masses should be used to highlight the importance of interfaith harmony.

The Pakistan Ulema Council has formed a high-level committee of 20 members. which includes senior religious leadership from Christian and Muslim communities. This committee aims to probe the reasons for the Jaranwala incident in light of previous happenings to identify gaps and recommend measures to bridge them. Over the last year, there has been a considerable reduction in incidents related to blasphemy. Therefore, the sudden spike is both worrisome and detrimental to the future.

The sense of community is as important as trust in the justice system of a country for the society to progress. It is time to move on from mere condemnation to address core issues.



A day to celebrate Ukraine's resilience

KRAINE is celebrating its 32nd Independence Day anniversary today i.e. on 24 August. The Day this year in not being celebrated in the same mood and manner as previous years, nevertheless it is a day to celebrate the strength, resilience and identity of the Ukrainian people. Ukrainian unity

has never been stronger than it is today, almost 18 months since Russia's full-scale illegal invasion in February 2022. The history of the Ukrainian state dates back at least one and a half thousand years. to 482 AD, when the city of Kyiv was founded. Declaring independence in 1991, Ukrainians finally began to walk the long-awaited path towards democratic development, reforms and European integration. But this centurieslong struggle has been brutally curtailed due to the aggressive behaviour of Ukraine's larger Russian neighbour to its east. Ukraine's Independence Day is

celebrated just ten days after Pakistan's, but the Ukraine-Pa-

kistan relations started long before official diplomatic ties were established in 1992. Back in the 1960s and 70s, Ukrainian specialists contributed to Pakistan's economic growth through its support to key Pakistani industries, for example the construction of Pakistan Steel Mills in Karachi and hydroelectric plants in Tarbela and Kalabagh. For decades, Ukraine has played a vital role in supporting Pakistani military strength and its ability to defend its people. And Ukraine has been a nation that has extended its hand to Pakistan in times of need, aiding it during times of poor harvest. At the peak of the "grain crisis" in 2020, Ukrainian traders covered twothirds of the grain deficit in Pakistan, exporting more than 1.2 million tons of wheat to feed Pakistanis.

This could not contrast more starkly with Russia's despicable behaviour based on vested interest – something that has not only caused untold suffering in Ukraine, but has directly impacted the lives of ordinary citizens around the world. From the bustling streets of Karachi to the serene mountains of Gilgit-Baltistan, the consequences of Putin's actions reach us here. Pakistani people feel the pinch as prices soar, pushing the most vulnerable citizens even closer to the brink. The cost of fuel has skyrocketed and the price of wheat has risen dramatically. Russia's unilateral decision to withdraw from a vital international grain deal means every roti and naan will now cost more. Economists say Putin's invasion has cost Pakistan up to 1% of its GDP, pushing more and more Pakistanis into poverty.

In its just struggle, Ukraine relies on its military forces along with the assistance from its international friends and partners. What is at stake is not just Ukraine's future but the UN Charter and international law, which support the sovereignty, territorial integrity and independence of all countries. We must never let countries attempt to rewrite borders by force. The UK, a long-standing friend of Ukraine, is inspired by the ongoing resistance and brav-

ery of the Ukrainian people in the face of Russian aggression and atrocities.

Eighteen months ago, Putin thought he would overwhelm Ukraine in three days. He underestimated the resolve of the Ukrainian people, the skill and determination of their Armed Forces, and the world's commitment to Ukraine's independence. Putin's military strategy clearly has not worked: he is isolated on the world stage. Over 40 nations, ranging from China to Turkey, the UAE and South Africa, attended the Peace Conference in Saudi Arabia. Over 20 countries have now committed to helping Ukraine win the war through military support. The UK and our

partners will continue to provide Ukraine with humanitarian, economic and military aid until Russian forces leave, which would be the quickest path to securing a just and sustainable peace. Ukraine will win this war and we must all stand with them for as long as it takes. The Ukrainian spirit shines brightly. In Ukraine's hour of need, we call for the people of Pakistan to continue to support their brothers and sisters in Ukraine. Russia's invasion will fail. Moscow cannot hope to outlast Ukraine's resolve and international support.


