

The privatization of state-owned entities



T HE Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) convened its special session on October 4, 2023, with a primary focus on enhancing export activities. During this session, comprehensive deliberations took place, aiming to advance strategies that would bolster exports. Furthermore, the SIFC engaged in in-depth discussions regarding the privatization of several state-owned enterprises, most notably the Pakistan International Airlines (PIA). It is worth noting that the privatization process for PIA has already been initiated, with plans to solicit expressions of interest in December of this year. While the decision to divest from underperforming state-owned entities that have been draining significant resources

from the public treasury is a prudent one, equal emphasis must be placed on ensuring that these privatized enterprises undergo substantial improvements in terms of performance and efficiency. The privatization of the Pakistan Telecom Company (PTCL) in 2005, when it was acquired by Etisalat, the UAE Telecom giant, marked a significant turning point in its trajectory. While there have been some notable innovations, particularly in the cellular sector, it's undeniable that the performance of PTCL has faced challenges since the privatization. One glaring issue has been the declining relevance of landline systems, which have seen a significant decrease in utility. Despite introducing innovative packages in the cellular sector, PTCL's support services for landline subscribers have exhibited notable shortcomings. This stands in stark contrast to the earlier era when PTCL was under government control, where the service quality was generally more dependable.

The SIFC, unveiled in June this year, seems to be a concerted effort by the military leadership to bolster the struggling economy of our nation. Although the precise mechanisms by which this novel initiative will rejuvenate Pakistan's ailing economy remain unclear, it has ignited a significant debate: Was there a genuine necessity for such an entity when pre-existing institutions like the Board of Investment (BOI) have, thus far, failed to yield tangible results? Is it wise to establish additional institutions, potentially funded by the public treasury, when previous institutions of a similar nature have failed to deliver desired outcomes? What sets apart the SFIC from the BOI, addressing the gaps that were evident in the latter?

Assuming that SFIC aims to distinguish itself from other institutions, the key question for attracting foreign investments is the quality of our business environment. Unfortunately, our current conditions fall short. Conversations with diplomats in Islamabad reveal that foreign investors are primarily concerned about law and order, legal procedures, and a conducive business environment for their operations. There is no doubt that the blue economy plays a pivotal role in shaping a country's overall economic landscape in today's world. Countries such as Indonesia and our neighboring nation, India, have made significant efforts to prioritize and harness the potential of the blue economy. It is quite striking that the concept of the blue economy seems conspicuously absent from our national priorities. Notably, even the newly-formed SFIC lacks representation from the maritime ministry, indicating a lack of recognition for Pakistan's untapped potential in the blue economy. This represents a missed opportunity for the SFIC, which should ideally be an inclusive organization, capable of leveraging resources from all available sectors. Undoubtedly, Pakistan is in dire need of immediate measures to bolster its economic well-being. However, it is imperative that any new initiatives are meticulously planned and executed, preceded by thorough research and analysis. Rushing into initiatives without a comprehensive approach can risk yielding suboptimal outcomes. Economic stability is undeniably intertwined with political stability, and the most viable path to attaining this political stability hinges on conducting free, fair, and

punctual elections. This is a fundamental step in ensuring that the snation's governance is representative and accountable to its people.

Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman (MBS) has made it clear that Saudi Arabia considers the establishment of an independent Palestinian state to be a crucial prerequisite for recognizing Israel



N a historic and groundbreaking development, Saudi Arabia has appointed Ambassador Nayef al-Sudairi as the Kingdom's first-ever envoy to Palestine. Ambassador Nayef al-Sudairi wasted no time upon his arrival in Palestine, boldly affirming Saudi Arabia's commitment to the establishment of a sovereign Palestinian state with East Jerusalem as its rightful capital.

In a series of diplomatic exchanges, Palestinian officials engaged in constructive discussions with their Saudi counterparts. As part of the Kingdom's commitment to recognizing Israel, both sides have to reach a significant understanding. Israel will have to halt the construction of new settlements, empower Palestinians with greater control over security and construction activities in the West Bank, endorse full Palestinian membership in the United Nations, and provide consent for the establishment of a Palestine Liberation Organization office in Washington and a US consulate in East Jerusalem.

Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Sal-

man (MBS) has made it clear that Saudi Arabia considers the establishment of an independent Palestinian state to be a crucial prerequisite for recognizing Israel. Moreover, MBS appears to seek specific support from the United States for Saudi Arabia's efforts to regain ties with Israel. There are five key areas in which the Saudis hope for proactive actions from both the US and Israel.

Saudi Arabia has consistently advocated for the establishment of an independent Palestinian state with Al-Ouds (Jerusalem) as its capital. While there may be some skepticism about the seriousness of Saudi Arabia's commitment to this cause, the majority view is that Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman (MBS) is unlikely to grant Israel's demands without receiving substantial assurances in return. Saudi Arabia has chosen to approach the issue of recognizing Israel with caution, unlike the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Bahrain, which swiftly established diplomatic relations with Israel. Consequently, both the UAE and Bahrain have seen an influx of Jewish residents, many of whom have acquired UAE residency status. It is believed that some members of the Jewish community in these countries aim to exert influence on their respective political landscapes, reflecting a strategy that has been observed in various places. That is how Jews operate everywhere. For example in Ukraine the Prime Minister Denys Shmyhal and other key officials happen to be the Jews and thus wield potential control over government affairs.

Saudi Arabia is committed to enhancing its defense capabilities and reducing dependency on allied nations like Pakistan for its defense requirements. portance of having its own weapons development facilities. This approach will enable the nation to have greater control over its defense technology and reduce reliance on external suppliers. It is committed to ensuring that its weapons development program operates independently and free from external influences. Historically, Saudi Arabia has cultivated strong diplomatic ties with Republican administrations in the United States. However, its relations with Democratic governments have often encountered challenges. It is reasonable to assume that the Saudi leadership closely monitors the US presidential elections, as the outcome can significantly impact their foreign policy.

Should the Republicans secure the presidency, Saudi Arabia may continue its cordial relationship, maintaining the status quo. However, if the Demo-

crats maintain control of the White House, the Saudi leadership may find it necessary to reassess and adapt their diplomatic priorities. In essence, Saudi Arabia's foreign policy is responsive to the changing dynamics of US politics, and they are prepared to adjust their strategies to ensure productive relations with whichever party holds power in Washington. Mohammad Bin Salman (MBS) is committed to fostering peace and reducing animosities in the Middle East by 2030. One of the most significant steps towards achieving this goal is establishing peaceful relations with long-time arch-rival Iran. Similarly, pursuing a truce in Yemen is a top priority for MBS. Peace with Iraq, Syria, Libya has already been achieved. Furthermore, the potential easing of tensions with Israel could reshape the entire political landscape of the Middle East.

As widely recognized, Saudi Arabia holds the esteemed title of Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques. While there is speculation among certain commentators that the Saudi government may seek a similar custodianship role for the Al Aqsa Mosque, it's crucial to note that the Al Aqsa Mosque is presently under the custodianship of Jordan.

Iran, another important players in the Middle East has voiced concern over growing bonhomie between the Arab states and Israel. The Iranian President in his recent statement categorically warned all those states wishing to forge deeper partnership with Israel to weigh all pros and cons first for Israel, according to the Iranian administration, can never be a trusted partner for the Muslim world.

Regarding the issue of Israeli recognition by the two major Muslim powers, Indonesia and Pakistan, there have been reports indicating that both countries have faced significant pressure to improve their relations with Israel. Recently, high-level Indonesian officials engaged in several crucial meetings with Palestinian representatives to discuss the nature of the pressure exerted on them and the incentives offered if Indonesia were to recognize Israel. However, it's worth noting that the current Indonesian government under President Joko Widodo has firmly rejected any such move.

Looking ahead, despite the upcoming Presidential elections scheduled for February 2024, many analysts believe that Indonesia's stance on the Israel-Palestine issue is unlikely to undergo a substantial change.

Pakistan too may not change its stand on this issue no matter which political party forms government as a result of the upcoming general elections. Pakistan is likely to recognize Israel only when an Independent Palestine state is established with Al Qadus as its capital. Pakistan has traditionally been a supporter of the Palestinian cause and a vocal advocate for their rights. This support is not tied to any particular political party but reflects a broader national consensus. The Palestinian issue holds significant importance in the hearts and minds of the Pakistani people.

In conclusion, while political parties may change in Pakistan, the country's stance on recognizing Israel is deeply rooted in historical, geopolitical, and national considerations. It is likely to remain unchanged until progress is made towards the establishment of an independent Palestinian state with East Jerusalem as its capital.

Afghan-India Honeymoon is over

TNDIA invested heavily in Afghanistan, allocating more than \$3 billion for aid and reconstruction initiatives. These efforts encompassed the development of critical infrastructure, including roads, bridges, dams, power stations, schools, hospitals, and the Afghan Parliament building. India also extended humanitarian aid, providing food, clothing, medicine, and shelter, along with scholarships for Afghan students and training for Afghan security forces. This support included weapons, equipment, and military vehicles for the Afghan National Security Forces (ANSF).

The primary, albeit undeclared, objective of India's engagement with Afghanistan was to counter Pakistan's influence in the region. While publicly stating aims like leveraging Afghanistan's strategic location as a gateway to Central Asia and fostering goodwill with the Afghan government and people, both India and Afghanistan acknowledged the complexities of their alliance. They recognized that India's involvement was primarily driven by self-interest, and questions lingered about the long-term sustainability of these efforts given the ever-evolving political and security dynamics in Afghanistan.

Ehsanullah Ehsan, a central leader and former spokesman for the Pakistani Taliban, revealed in a 2021 foreign media interview an alleged collaboration between Afghan security forces, specifically the NDS (National Directorate of Security), and India's intelligence agency, RAW (Research and Analysis Wing), in supporting cross-border terrorist activities targeting Pakistan. According to Ehsan, he was involved in such activities from sanctuaries on the Afghan side of the border.

Ehsan disclosed that the TTP (Tehriki-Taliban Pakistan), which had sought refuge in Afghanistan since June 2014, established connections with the Afghan intelligence agency, NDS. Through this link, they established contact with operatives of India's RAW.

Ehsan claimed that NDS and RAW facilitated the harboring of anti-Pakistan militants and assisted in establishing "special committees" in Afghanistan to maintain contact with the NDS.

The statements made by Ehsanullah Ehsan in his interview had brought to the forefront allegations of clandestine collaboration and assistance provided to elements opposed to Pakistan by Afghan and Indian intelligence agencies and raised concerns about the nature of regional dynamics and the potential implications for security and stability in the region.

The abrupt withdrawal of the previous Afghan government and U.S. forces in 2021, leaving behind military and civilian hardware worth billions of dollars, not only dashed the United States' aspirations for Afghanistan but also eroded India's influence within the Afghan government. The rapid rise of the new Taliban regime, which has established itself as the de facto governing authority, albeit awaiting international recognition, may have signaled a reluctance to serve as a tool of Indian policy against Pakistan in the region.

Furthermore, it underscores the ageold axiom that India primarily acts in its own self-interest and may change its loyalty when its interests demand it. India, after a careful assessment of the costs and benefits associated with maintaining friendly relations with the Taliban, as well as the desire to appease the United States have chosen the latter path. The benefits it stands to gain from its association with the United States appear to outweigh any potential loss in its status as the largest regional donor to Afghanistan over the past two decades. The withdrawal of U.S. military forces from Afghanistan had sharply diminished its role and influence within Afghanistan. Currently, India has not publicly disclosed any immediate plans to reopen its embassy in Kabul which it shut down immediately after withdrawal of US forces in 2021. Whereas recently, Afghanistan, citing a lack of cooperation from the host government, has opted to close its embassy in New Delhi. These diplomatic moves underscores a notable shift in India's stance and priorities, signaling a reduced interest in maintaining its previous level of engagement with the Taliban-led government in Afghanistan.

This recalibration in India's approach is influenced by several key factors. Foremost among them is the explicit declaration by the predominantly Pashtun Taliban that Islam will be the guiding framework for Afghanistan's political structures. India has closely aligned itself with the United States and is wary of the Taliban due to perceived close ties between the group and Pakistan. India views the Taliban as an extension of Pakistan's influence in the region, reinforcing its decision to reassess its engagement with the new Afghan government.

India's decision not to extend patronage to the Taliban-led government. coupled with the Taliban interim government's move to close down its embassy, has cast a shadow of uncertainty over the future of thousands of Afghan students, professionals, patients, and businessmen residing in India.

According to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), as of October 2023, there are approximately 18,500 Afghans living in India. Among this population, more than 10,000 Afghan students find themselves grappling with the challenge of renewing their visas. Around 5,000 professionals are facing obstacles in renewing their work permits, while over 2,000 patients are encountering difficulties in accessing essential medical care. Additionally, Afghan military personnel are struggling to receive their salaries and cover their expenses, and asylum seekers are confronting hurdles in obtaining refugee status. This complex situation highlights the multifaceted humanitarian and administrative challenges faced by Afghan residents in India amid the evolving political landscape in Afghanistan.

Maintaining all weather friendly relations by Pakistan with Interim Afghan Government have also not been the bed of roses though Pakistan played a pivotal role in facilitating the signing of the Doha agreement, which ultimately led to the withdrawal of U.S. forces from Afghanistan, the collapse of Mr. Ashraf Ghani's government, the alteration of India's relationship with Afghanistan, and the installation of the Taliban interim government in Kabul.

Subsequently, Pakistan took a series of steps to support the Taliban Interim government in consolidating its authority in Afghanistan following the U.S. evacuation in 2021. Pakistan extended substantial economic assistance to the Taliban government, including essential supplies like food, fuel, and medicine. This support played a crucial role in addressing the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan and helped the Taliban maintain basic services for the Afghan population. Pakistan also actively advocated for the Taliban on the international stage, encouraging other countries to recognize the Taliban government and offer assistance. These diplomatic efforts improved the Taliban's standing within the international community.

The guests also enjoyed traditional Malaysian cuisines and cultural performance.





















Embracing self-care through breast self-examination

REAST cancer is a significant health concern worldwide, and early detection is crucial for effective treatment and improved outcomes. Behind the statistics and risk factors lie countless personal stories of courage and resilience. By understanding the impact of this disease on both individuals and society, we can and should make continued efforts towards improved outcome of this disease by prevention and early detection.

Firstly, it is essential to acknowledge the glaring statistics surrounding breast cancer. According to global estimates, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women, accounting for approximately one in four cancer diagnoses. In 2020, an estimated 684,996 women across the world died from breast cancer, out of which 56,366 were in Pakistan. These numbers are overwhelming and they emphasize the need for vigilance and awareness. These statistics are not just numbers; they represent mothers, sisters, daughters, and friends who have been touched by this disease.

Disease like breast cancer brings a sense of uncertainty and fear for those affected. The journey of diagnosis and treatment can be physically and emotionally challenging. The toll it takes on patients and their families cannot be taken lightly. It takes a lot of strength and resilience of individuals facing breast cancer, as they endure surgeries, chemotherapy, radiation, and a myriad of side effects with unwavering determination. In the fight against breast cancer, one of the most powerful weapons we have is knowledge and early detection. Breast self-examination (BSE) is a simple yet crucial practice that empowers individuals to take control of their own health and can help identify potential breast cancer symptoms at an early stage. According to several studies conducted in different cities of Pakistan only 24% of female had heard of breast self-examination. This article is an effort to emphasize the importance of BSE and provide basic information about the signs and symptoms of breast cancer.

Understanding Breast Cancer:

Breast cancer is a malignant growth that occurs in the breast tissue, primarily in the ducts or lobules. It can affect both women and less frequently, men. While various risk factors (being female, old age, dense breast tissue, genetic predisposition, etc) contribute to the development of breast cancer, early detection remains one of the most effective ways to combat this disease.

The Role of Self Breast Examination (BSE):

BSE is a proactive, hands-on approach for individuals to monitor their breast health. It involves regularly checking one's breasts for any changes or abnormalities. The goal of doing a breast self-exam is recognizing what's normal for you. Knowing how your breasts typically look and feel can help you notice a change (if one were to occur). Here's why BSE is crucial:

Early Detection Saves Lives: Breast cancer, when detected at an early stage, is often more treatable, with a higher chance of complete recovery.

Empowerment and Awareness: BSE empowers individuals by allowing them to actively participate in their own health. It fosters awareness of one's body and helps identify potential issues promptly.

Cost-Effective: BSE doesn't require any special equipment or medical visits, making it a cost-effective method of monitoring breast health.

Performing Self Breast Examination:

Here are the steps to perform a basic BSE:

Choose a regular time: Pick a specific time each month to perform BSE, ideally a few days after your menstrual cycle ends if you menstruate.

In front of a mirror:

Stand in front of a mirror with your hands on your hips. Look for any changes in breast size, shape, or contour. Check for any skin changes, such as dimpling or redness. Examine the nipples for any discharge or inversion.

Lying down:

Lie down with a pillow under your right shoulder. Use your left hand to examine your right breast. Use the pads of your fingers (not tips), moving in small circles, to feel for any lumps or irregularities. Cover the entire breast, including the underarm area. Repeat the process for your left breast using your right hand. **Upward motion:**

Sit or stand up. Repeat the examination for both breasts using an upward motion. Pay attention to any changes or abnormalities. Signs and Symptoms of Breast Cancer:

It's important to be aware of the common signs and symptoms of breast cancer, as early detection relies on recognizing these changes:

Lump or thickening: The most common symptom is a lump or thickening in the breast or underarm area.

Changes in breast Shape or Size: Any unexplained changes in breast shape or size should be examined.

Skin changes: Look for redness, dimpling, or puckering of the breast skin, which may resemble an orange peel.

Nipple abnormalities: This includes nipple discharge (other than breast milk), inversion, or a change in nipple appearance.

Breast pain: While not always a sign of breast cancer, unexplained breast pain or discomfort should be discussed with a healthcare professional.

Swelling: Swelling or inflammation in the breast, especially if it's only on one side, should be evaluated.

Rash or itchiness: Persistent rash or itchiness around the nipple or breast area requires attention.

Nipple retraction: If your nipple becomes inverted or changes position, it should be examined.


Enlarged lymph nodes: Swollen lymph nodes under the arm or around the collarbone could indicate breast cancer.

By regularly examining your breasts, you are not just checking for lumps or changes – you are affirming your right to a healthy future. In closing, I urge you to make breast self-examination a part of your regular routine. Encourage your friends, family members, and colleagues to do the same. Let's foster a culture of self-care and awareness, not just during Breast Cancer Awareness Month but throughout the entire year. Together, we can make a difference in the lives of those we love and in our own lives as well.




