

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

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Election are around the corner at last



Thanks to the Supreme Court of Pakistan that the general elections have finally been announced, which will take place on February 8, ,2024. With this announcement all parties are likely to gear up their elections campaigns sans the PTI as most of its leadership is still behind the bars. The return of Nawaz Sharif, the PML-N's leader and former Prime Minister, after nearly four years of self-imposed exile has undoubtedly stirred a wave of poignant moments. As he graced the stage during the Minar-e-Pakistan gathering, with his presence, the audience witnessed heartfelt scenes, such as his warm embrace with his daughter, Maryam Nawaz, and his younger brother, Shehbaz Sharif. The sheer scale of the attendance at this homecoming event was undeniably massive,

and this is hardly surprising, given the substantial support the PML-N received from the state machinery. It evoked memories of PTI public gatherings, where the turnout was nothing short of phenomenal. However, it's worth noting that during that era, PTI held a special status with the Establishment, which contributed to the massive crowds they attracted. Nawaz Sharif's return marks a significant moment in Pakistan's political landscape, underscoring his enduring influence in the country's politics.

His return on one hand promises to breathe new life into the PML-N, which has faced significant challenges, particularly following the 16-month tenure in government after the PTI was voted out. Nawaz Sharif, during his speech, provided insights into his previous terms in office when, in his view, accessibility was widespread, even for those less fortunate. While avoiding specific reference to the PDM period, he attributed the entirety of the nation's troubles to the PTI government. Without explicitly mentioning Imran Khan, the former prime minister questioned the authenticity of his religious gestures. According to Sharif, the PTI chairman publicly counting beads attempted to project himself as a devout figure, which, in Sharif's opinion, did not align with his actions.

Nawaz Sharif exhibited a remarkable degree of discretion when discussing his removal from power. Though he refrained from directly naming the Establishment, his insinuations left little doubt about who he believed was responsible for his ouster. With a touch of literary finesse, he chose to invoke the words of Mirza Ghalib, hinting at the immense reservoir of untold secrets. In a poetic flourish, he implied that if he were to reveal the full extent of what transpired in the past, his tears alone could inundate the entire world. This combination of careful words and poetic allusions conveyed the depth of his experience while maintaining a sense of dignity and intrigue. However, the real question remains: can he maintain this level of self-control in the days ahead? Nawaz Sharif has a long history of strained relations with the establishment in Pakistan. Each time he clashed with the powerful stakeholders in our political system, it ultimately led to his removal from office. In his three previous tenures as prime minister, he was unable to complete a full five-year term due to these confrontations. Considering his track record and his approach to dealing with establishment involvement in political matters, it's reasonable to predict that even if, by some stroke of luck, he manages to come into power for the fourth time, the outcome may not be different from what we've seen in the past." Winning back the trust of the Establishment may indeed pose a formidable challenge for him. His closest allies have repeatedly counseled him that unless he reconciles with the Establishment, his political prospects could remain in the shadows.

He presented a comprehensive 9-point agenda aimed at steering the country out of its current crises. However, it's worth noting that two vital aspects appear to be absent from this agenda. Firstly, there is a conspicuous absence of any clarification regarding the role of the Establishment in politics. Secondly, there is a noticeable lack of details about his vision for combating corruption in Pakistan. Corruption has been a persistent roadblock to Pakistan's progress, despite its abundance of resources. It is high time to address this issue head-on, as it is a major factor contributing to the country's ongoing struggles. Let us hope that all parties shall get a level playing field. Keeping the PTI out of electoral race won't serve

anybody's purpose. Pakistan's challenges are of grave nature, which can only be matched through an all-inclusive political approach.

GAZA TRAGEDY

HILE the tragic accounts of large-scale violence against innocent Palestinians persist at the hands of Israeli forces, there is a noticeable disparity in the responses from the Muslim ummah and the global community at large. It is disheartening to observe that non-Muslim countries have reacted swiftly and resolutely to Israeli actions, while the Muslim states have, for the most part, remained passive and indecisive. Notably, some Latin American countries, such as Bolivia, have taken the bold step of severing ties with Israel, whereas the OIC and Arab League are still deliberating their course of action. Among the Arab states, Bahrain has sown some guts by expelling the Israeli ambassador.

The situation in Gaza can be analyzed from multiple perspectives. Firstly, the conflict escalated when there were indications of Saudi Arabia deepening its relationship with Tel Aviv, potentially formalizing diplomatic ties with the intention of recognizing Israel in the future. As reports suggest, Saudi Arabia's plan was to extend recognition to Israel once Palestine achieved full independence and sovereignty, with Al-Quds as its capital. Nevertheless, after Gaza tragedy Saudis of course will have to put their plans on hold, albeit, for a while. The U.S. stance on the issue is perplexing, to say the

least. It's challenging to comprehend how a superpower could seemingly support an aggressor, especially when the tragic loss of innocent lives is so evident. Some observers speculate that President Joe Biden's unwavering support for Israel may be influenced by his desire to secure backing from the Jewish community for upcoming elections.

Questions have also been raised the way Hamas conducted its operations. Its critics believe if it did not have the Plan B and C then why it ventured on this mission due to which thousands of innocent people have lost their lives. It is also believed that Israel's prime objective is not to eliminate

Hamas rather to get the entire Gaza strip vacated from Palestinians. To eliminate Hamas may not be an issue for Israel as it knows it's all ins and outs given the fact that Hamas came into being with the very support and backing of Israel in order to contain Yasser Arafat's PLO at that time. It may be recalled that the bombing of the media tower in the Gaza Strip in May 2021 highlighted the unwavering resolve of Israel in its pursuit of eliminating not only the messengers but also the innocent Palestinian people who have endured decades of Israeli brutality. This tragic event had claimed the lives of over 180 Palestinians, including children, and left hundreds of thousands homeless.

Israel's relentless campaign of terror reached a horrifying climax when they targeted Palestinians gathered for prayers in the Al-Aqsa mosque on the night of the 27th of Ramadan. Even in the face of this brutality, the so-called Muslim Ummah responded with an outpouring of grandiose statements and promises to protect Al-Agsa mosque and come to the aid of the innocent people. Regrettably, these vows remained unfulfilled, and their pledges never materialized into concrete actions.

The OIC foreign ministers' conference, held recently in Saudi Arabia, appeared to present an opportunity for addressing concerns related to Israel. However, it fell





disappointingly short of expectations as foreign ministers largely delivered routine speeches and failed to take substantial actions. There are three prominent international platforms that the Palestinian people and the broader Muslim community, often referred to as the Ummah, could look to for support: the United Nations, the Arab League, and the OIC.

Placing excessive hope in the United Nations may be unwise, as it often seems influenced by anti-Muslim sentiments and constrained by its relationships with certain powerful nations. Given that Israel has strong backing from the United States, the UN's criticism of Israeli actions may be limited. The Secretary General's earnest appeals for a ceasefire have unfortunately fallen on deaf ears. It appears that his pleas have not gained the traction they deserve. In light of this, it becomes imperative for the Secretary General to reflect on his relevance and the justification for his continued leadership at the United Nations.

The OIC, on the other hand, has unfortunately been criticized for its ineffectiveness and resource-draining tendencies since its establishment. This 57-mem-





ber organization has consistently fallen short of meeting expectations. Despite several challenges faced by the Muslim community, the OIC has not been successful in taking meaningful action. It has, at times, appeared as a platform for rhetorical condemnations, particularly in addressing issues like Islamophobia and blasphemous depictions.


The OIC was founded in response to the 1969 arson incidents at Al Aqsa mosque, yet it has been unable to prevent subsequent attacks on the mosque by Israel due to the lack of a substantial response from the Ummah and the OIC itself. In the recent episode, most of the OIC member countries believe, though they do not admit it openly, that Hamas acts do not represent the will of the entire Palestine state hence at times they are loathe to back Hamas actions whole-heartedly.




Arab League is vet another stakeholder that can play a role, if it wishes to. But keeping in view the past practices, nothing tangible is expected from the Arab League as the block appears to be divided into two distinct camps - one openly supporting the US and Israel and another desiring a solution as per the wishes of the people of Palestine. But now when a tragedy has taken place it time for everyone to shun differences and try to save innocent Palestine people form the Israeli barbarities.

Israel will never listen to anybody until and unless it is given a matching response. The Iranian foreign minister proposed to declare Israeli acts as war crimes and genocide of Palestine people. The Iranian spiritual leader Ali Khamenei has asked the Muslim ummah to boycott Israel but of no use only because of severe internal fissures among the Muslim countries. As long as they remain divided the innocent Muslims would continue to reel under tyranny and subjugation.

It's important to remember that complex geopolitical issues like the Israeli-Palestinian conflict require a multifaceted and long-term approach. While a matching response may seem tempting, dialogue, diplomacy, and international cooperation are more likely to lead to lasting solutions and a more stable and secure future for the region. Whether it's Hamas or other Palestinian factions, it's important for them to recognize the significance of unity within their ranks and resist succumbing to external provocations. They should also heed the voices of those who genuinely support their cause and seek an amicable resolution in accordance with their aspirations.

They once again warned and gave an ultimatum to the Hospitals and the patients, some of them on life support systems, many babies in incubators and many more crippled due to constant and uninterrupted Israel bombardments to evacuate immediately to the South of Gaza and while those who had the strength and means to evacuate, their caravans were attacked Israel fighter jets without any mercy.

The statement of the UNSG was deeply rooted in the history of the Israel-Palestine conflict, a protracted and multifaceted dispute having historical, political, and territorial factors. It originated in the late 19th and early 20th centuries when Iewish immigration to Palestine, then part of the Ottoman Empire, increased, leading to tensions with the Arab population. The conflict was further fueled by the Balfour Declaration of 1917, which expressed British support for the establishment of a "national home for the Jewish people" in Palestine.

After World War II and the Holocaust, led to international support for the creation of a Jewish state and led to the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948. This event triggered a series of Arab-Israeli wars and further territorial disputes, particularly in the West Bank and Gaza Strip and gave birth to two organizations Hamas and Hezbollah deeply supporting and promoting palestinian cause.

The recent escalation of conflict between Hamas and Israel can be attributed to several factors. Hamas launched its attack in response to a culmination of longstanding grievances, including Israeli policies, violence at the Al-Agsa Mosque in Jerusalem, treatment of Palestinians, and the expansion of Israeli settlements. While Hamas justifies its actions as a response to these issues, Israel and the U.S. have rejected any moral equivalence between Hamas attacks on Israeli civilians and Israel's efforts to defend itself. Hamas anticipated that its actions would

draw Israel into a protracted conflict, potentially undermining the diplomatic normalization efforts and generating international sympathy for the Palestinian cause. The timing of the attack took advantage of domestic distractions in the Israeli government, allowing Hamas to act while Israel was internally preoccupied. Hamas, or the Islamic Resistance Movement, was founded in 1987 during the First Intifada (Palestinian uprising) against Israeli occupation. Hamas's core objectives include the establishment of an independent Palestinian state in the West Bank, Gaza Strip, and East Jerusalem, resistance against Israeli occupation, and the assertion of its Islamist ideology.

Hezbollah, on the other hand, is a Shiite militant and political organization based in Lebanon. It was formed in the early 1980s with the backing of Iran as a response to the Israeli invasion of Lebanon. Hezbollah is considered more powerful than the Lebanese army, and has engaged in conflicts with Israel, notably the 2006 Lebanon War.

While the USA, UK and rest of the western governments are standing astutely and resolutely with Israel, Russia stands with Hamas. This prompted the West to draw comparisons between Hamas's onslaught and Russia's war against Ukraine arguing that one was "a terrorist organization that attacked Israel" and the other "a terrorist state that attacked Ukraine." The United States has historically been a strong ally of Israel and has often supported Israel in the Israel-Palestine conflict. This support includes financial aid, military assistance, and diplomatic backing.

But on the other hand, Russia has long maintained close relations with Hamas and has never declared either wing of Hamas to be a terrorist group. Rather, eager to carve out a niche in the Middle East peace process, Russian diplomats have tried to unify different Palestinian factions, including Hamas, into a single political force in order to restart the peace process and promote a two-state solution. Unlike the west, USA and Russia, China has towed a neutral line since the war began and continues to call for a peaceful resolution to the conflict. In an official statement issued on October 8, the day after Hamas launched a surprise attack on Israel, China's foreign ministry called for a de-escalation in hostilities and for "relevant parties to remain calm, exercise restraint and immediately end the hostilities to protect civilians and avoid further deterioration of the situation".

Iran plays a crucial role in supporting Hamas financially and politically, although Iran has denied any direct involvement in the recent attack. However, Iran in an intimidating strong statement warmed Israel of crossing the redline and threatened Israel of dire consequence if the war expand to other parts of Middle East especially Lebanon. Western states, such as Australia and New Zealand, have only declared the military wing of Hamas-the Izz ad-Din al-Qassam Brigadesto be a terrorist organization. Others, such as the United States, have not made this distinction. The support of Iran, Russia, and Turkey for Palestine, contrasting with the backing of Israel by the USA and Western nations, has indeed starkly divided the world into clear-cut positions, painting many shades of gray within the conflict. This division intensifies the complexities of the situation.

The deployment of two U.S. aircraft carriers in Middle Eastern waters sends a clear message, serving as a warning against any misadventures. This stern posture raises the stakes, particularly with Iran and other Middle Eastern countries, creating an environment of heightened tension. Yet, amidst these developments, Russia and Iran remain resolute and undeterred by such deployments. This scenario underscores the intricate global dynamics at play and the fragility of peace in the region.

Certainly, conflicts, especially those involving powerful nations, can be brutal, causing immense suffering. The world often witnesses self-proclaimed champions of human rights backing their interests. In this ongoing conflict, some powerful nations support Israel while others stand by Palestinian civilians. Yet, history shows that even the bloodiest wars ultimately find resolution at the negotiating table. It's in the interest of all parties involved to put aside entrenched positions, attribute blame to the culprits, ensure justice for victims, and, most crucially, address the root causes, as underscored by the United Nations Secretary-General. Failure to do so could escalate this weeping conflict into a global conflagration, reminding us that the path to peace is always more desirable than the ravages of war.

The exhibition's purpose was to commemorate the 40-year diplomatic relationship between Pakistan and the Republic of Korea. During his address, the Joint Secretary of



ISLAMABAD: Acting Ambassador of Romania Eduard Preda has said celebration of the Romanian Army Day has a special meaning, focused on the idea of respect for fallen heroes. Therefore, the 25 of October is symbolizing the day in which the entire Romanian territory was liberated by the Romanian Army during the Second World War, on 25 October 1944. He expressed these views while speaking on the occasion of the Armed Forces Day of Romania. Air Marshal Irfan Ahmed of Pakistan Air Force was the chief guest.

Ambassador Preda further said, Army Day crowns through its symbolism a whole series of anniversary moments, attended not only by those dressed in military uniform, but by all segments of our society. It became a date with special significance in the calendar of celebration days in Romania. 'Today, Romanian Armed Forces, completely reformed and modernized up to the NATO and European Union standards, are assigned to foreign missions, contributing alongside with the allied and partner countries to the common effort of keeping peace and stability worldwide. In compliance with

the commitments deriving from the international treaties, agreements and memoranda whose signing party is, Romania had contingents of different sizes from all services - Army, Air and Naval Forces - available to multinational coalitions authorized to carry on peace support operations, humanitarian assistance, within the framework of UN, NATO, OSCE and EU-led Observing, Monitoring, Liaison and Training missions'.

He said for the Romanian Armed Forces. these years of contribution to foreign missions meant the maintenance, almost continuously, of a military force of variable size, integrated into UN, NATO and EU missions carried out in Africa and Asia, in the theatres of operations in Afghanistan. Iraq and Western Balkans. Almost 40,000 Romanian troops took part in different operations and missions out of national borders, gathering a valuable professional experience extremely useful in the transformation and the cooperation enhancement process of the Romanian Armed Forces with their NATO and EU counterparts. The contribution of the Romanian troops to the collective defence, peace keeping and restoration missions to enforce the UN Security Council Resolutions, of the international legislation and law reveals that the Romanian state complies consequently and in full faith with the commitments agreed with the allies and partners, according to the international legislation and treaties whose signing party Romania is, he added.

He said, 'Today, unfortunately, we are living in a very complicated security environment. The challenges we have to deal with every day, along with the war going on at NATO, EU and Romanian borders, all these prove that we need to be ready to defend our common values and freedoms and grant security and stability'.

He said, Ukraine's security means European and Euro-Atlantic security. In line with the NATO and European Union's policy. Romania stands in full solidarity with the people and government of Ukraine in the heroic defence of their country, helping Ukraine to uphold its fundamental right to self-defence with unprecedented levels of support as a response to the Russian Federation's full-scale, unprovoked and unlawful invasion of Ukraine. He said he was pleased to underline the excellent cooperation existing between Romanian and Pakistani Armed Forces which have developed over the years into a true and mutually partnership. Since there is not enough time to elaborate on the multifaceted and complex character of the cooperation, I will only mention that the Pakistani Navy will soon receive their third patrol vessel built at Damen Shipyard Galati, Romania. These vessels will provide the Pakistani Navy with highly effective search and rescue capabilities that will allow it to play an important role in safeguarding international trade routes from piracy and other threats like drugs and human trafficking or terrorism.

President denounces use of brutal force against innocent Palestinians

ISLAMABAD: President Dr Arif Alvi has denounced the use of brutal force against innocent Palestinians, and called for the lifting of the siege and opening of a humanitarian corridor for Palestinians. He said that Pakistan was seriously concerned at the incessant Israeli aggression against civilians, which had killed thousands of people including women, children, and elderly. He stressed that the international community should condemn the continued Israeli aggression in Gaza. He stated that Pakistan stood for a total withdrawal of Israel from all occupied Arab territories, including Jerusalem, as well as the establishment of an independent homeland for Palestinians with Al-Quds Sharif as its capital.

The President gave these remarks during a presentation of diplomatic credentials ceremony held at Aiwan-e-Sadr, today. The Ambassador-designate of Jordan, Dr Maen A.M. Khreasat, Ambassador-designate of Holy See, Archbishop Germano Penemote Apostolic Nuncio, Ambassador-designate of Czech Republic, Mr Ladislav Steinhubel, the High Commissioner-designate of Brunei Darussalam, Colonel (r) Pengiran Haji Kamal Bashah bin Pengiran Haji Ahmad, and the Ambassador-designate of Qatar to Pakistan, Ali Mubarak A.E. Al-Khater, presented their diplomatic credentials to President Dr Arif Alvi and later separately called on him. Talking to the envoys, the President said that Pakistan was closely monitoring the situation in Palestine and wanted the restoration of the inalienable rights of the people of Palestine. He highlighted that Pakistan had consistently supported

the Palestine cause, and wanted a comprehensive resolution of all outstanding Arab-Israeli disputes to ensure lasting peace in the region. Speaking to the envoys, the President said that Pakistan wanted to further intensify political, economic and cultural links with all friendly countries, besides increasing bilateral trade and investment relations. He highlighted that Pakistan had established a Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC), which provided a one window facility for investment in IT, Corporate

Farming, Minerals and Energy sectors of Pakistan. He said that foreign investors should benefit of the investment friendly policies of Pakistan and invest in these sectors. The President also highlighted the gross human rights violations being committed by India in the Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir. The President congratulated the envoys on their new assignments and expressed the confidence that they would further strengthen bilateral relations of their respective countries with Pakistan.

ISLAMABAD: Jawad Sohrab Malik, Prime Minister Special Assistant on Overseas Pakistanis has said Pakistan and Hungary enjoy excellent relations adding these relations are poised to grow further even in the days to come. Malik expressed these views while speaking as chief guest on the occasion of the National Day of Hungary. A large number of guests hailing from various walks of life attended the reception. The chief guest further said that Hungary had supported Pakistan on all occasions especially on the issue of GSP Plus status. He hoped trade and economic relations would also be strengthened. Ambassador of Hungary Bela Fazekas in his speech said, on the 23 October 1956 a student protest in Budapest turned into a national uprising against Communist dictatorship. The joy of freedom lasted only two weeks when the Soviet military aggression crushed the heroic struggle of the freedom fighters. He added, it was only 33 years later Hungary regained its independence. After defeating the revolution of 1956 the so called "Hungarian question" was still on the agenda of UN General Assembly for many years.

'Hungary is grateful to the Pakistani diplomacy for supporting the cause of the Hungarian revolution in the United Nations. In 1962 Sir Muhammad Zafrulla Khan the President of the General Assembly played an important role in forcing the Hungarian authorities to release hundreds of Hungarian freedom fighters from the prisons', he added. Ladies and gentlemen, although diplomatic relations between our two coutries are only 58 years old, the people-to-people relations between Hungary and this part of the subcontinent have started much earlier. The cultural and intellectual life of the 19th and early 20th century Lahore would not have been so rich and vibrant without the Hungarian artists, professors, doctors, orientalists who lived and worked there. A few years back our Embassy has started a project to make the Pakistani public realize the extent of the intellectual footprint of this humble Hungarian presence.

Ambassador Fazekas said, Hungary is not a big power. Neither politically, nor economically. But there is something, which gives us a soft power status, something we Hungarians are very proud of. Just three weeks ago two Nobel Prizes, one for Medicine and one for Physics were awarded to Hungarian Scientists. The first one was the recognition of the mRNA molecule discoveries by a Hungarian lady professor that paved the way for COVID-19 vaccines saving the life of millions of people all around the word during the COVID pandemic. Since

the introduction of the Nobel Prize, this prestigious prize was awarded to 19 Hungarian scientists. This is quite remarkable for a country with a population of 10 million people. It is also the recognition of the high quality of the Hungarian higher education. Hungary is ready to offer this rich educational, academic and scientific background for everyone including young Pakistanis. Every year the Hungarian government provides 400 state sponsored scholarships to Pakistani students. Investing into knowledge and skills pays the best interest. You never know if there is a future Pakistani Nobel Prize winner among those currently studying with scolarships in Hungarian universities.

He said, the frequent political contacts, regular visits and meetings between our two countries provide a solid political basis for enhancement of our multilevel cooperation. In February 2023 we had the first ever visit of a Pakistani Foreign minister to Hungary. The minister was offered a podium to deliver his message in front of 130 Hungarian Ambassadors from all around the world. The visit created a new momentum for every aspect of our cooperation. Our trade has doubled in the last four years. There are more and more Pakistani-Hungarian joint ventures in the field of water management and agriculture.

France in favor of abolishment of death penalty: envoy

ISLAMABAD: Ambassador of France to Pakistan Nicolas Galey has said France, like its European partners and dozens of countries around the world, many of which represented here firmly opposed to the death penalty in all places and all circumstances. He expressed these views during a function organized at the French residence.

He said this on the occasion of the 21st World Day against the Death Penalty. He thanked the JPP people for their presence and screening of a documentary.

Ambassador Galey said, his country supported unequivocally the dynamics of the movement in favor of the universal abolition of the death penalty. In 2002 four new States joined this movement (Kazakhstan, Papua New Guinea, Sierra Leone and Central African Republic). The adoption in December 2022 by a historic number of 125 States, of the United Nations General Assembly resolution calling for a universal moratorium on the death penalty is a real progress. 'Despite this progress, executions continue. In 2022 the number of executions reached highest in five years 883 persons, in 20 countries, were executed that is plus 53% compared to the previous year.

France deplores this trend and calls on these countries to observe moratorium like Pakistan since 2019 - with a view to definitely abolishing the death penalty. In this regard, we call on all states to ratify the second Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights. As we will celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights signed in Paris on 10 December, 1948, France is more than ever committed against the death penalty.

The ambassador said the Capital punishment is a cruel and unjust punishment. In 1948 exactly one century before the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted, Victor Hugo, then a member of the French National Assembly tried to pass a law abolishing the death penalty and uttered these words; "The death penalty is the special and eternal sign of barbarism. The right of life and death belongs only to God".






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
